# Preface

The drug problem has not been affecting one nation, one region, or one race but also severely threatening to all nations and mankind. In addition, the global production, demand, and trafficking of illicit drugs have devastating effects on people's peaceful existence and infrastructure, including health, economy, social fabric, culture, and politics. Myanmar is not only affected by the use of heroin but also by the emergence of synthetic drugs such as crystal meth, ecstasy, ketamine and happy water. The government of Myanmar has developed drug control strategic plans that cover various aspects of health, socio-economic development, rule of

law, and law enforcement, considering it as a national duty that is being participated by the entire people. Constructive activities for the future of the nation may be weakened if future generations of various societies become the victims of psychotropic substances.

In terms of controlling drug problem, and ensuring stability and tranquility in a country, a systematically operating mechanism of the government and adherence to the rule of law play a key role. It is urgent to seek cooperation with local people and ethnic groups. However, drug law enforcement agencies face challenges in implementing effective investigation, enforcement and control measures because essential chemicals used in drug production easily flow into the country through unstable and remote border areas. Furthermore, drugs produced using those chemicals are trafficked across the border to countries in the region and those with higher demands.

The national government is making efforts to obtain eternal peace by ratifying National Cease-Fire Agreement (NCA) with the ethnic armed groups, with the aim of achieving national stability, tranquility and development. Negotiation and cooperation with some signatory ethnic armed groups to NCA are being implemented for drug law enforcement and preventive measures. Once political talks are completed and NCA is ratified with ethnic armed groups, national stability, development and drug control activities can be implemented through the involvement of all national stakeholders as a national priority effort.

Myanmar is also a signatory country to the United Nations Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs-1961, the United Nations Convention on Psychotropic Substances-1971, and United Nations Convention against Illicit Trafficking in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances-1988. Myanmar actively cooperates with the international community in accordance with the provisions of the said conventions.

The United Nations General Assembly Special Session on the World Drug Problem, (UNGASS) was held at New York, United States of America, in April, 2016. During the special



session, resolutions were adopted for an action plan to implement drug policy with holistic approach. Based on United Nations guidelines, Myanmar formulated a new national drug control policy which was officially launched on February 20, 2018. The new policy was designed with supportive approaches to achieve sustainable development goals in line with the standards and norms of all three international drug control conventions.

To implement the new national drug control policy, the strategic action plan was adopted during the Union Government Meeting (3/2020) on February 5, 2020. The plan is being utilized as a guideline to implement work plan in regions, states, and Nay Pyi Taw Council area, based on the various drug situations in each location.

Myanmar adopted the Narcotics and Hazardous Substances Law in 1974, the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law in 1993, and the Rules Relating to Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law in 1995. However, the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law was amended to update on February 14, 2018. Similarly, the amendment of the Rules Relating to Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law is currently in progress and will be officially regulated in the near future.

The Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control was established in 1976 and has been modified over time to include 10 working sectors. These modifications occurred in 1989, 1993, 2007, 2011, 2012, and 2016. In order to approach drug law enforcement activities with an international perspective and follow the relevant standards and norms, a Community-based Supervisory Committee was included, comprising of relevant ministries. The committee was reorganized to include 11 working sectors on January 10, 2020.

In Myanmar, drug elimination efforts are being carried out by the Tatmadaw, Myanmar Police Force, and Custom Department. Moreover, Drug Enforcement Division was specifically formed under the supervision of Myanmar Police Force. Drug Enforcement Division is comprised of 10 sub-divisions, and 50 anti-narcotic taskforces which are deployed in drug production and trafficking dense areas, as well as border areas. In 2022, the No (11) X-Ray sub-division and 6 X-Ray taskforces were added to strengthen drug law enforcement, compared to 10 Sub-divisions, and 65 taskforces as of February 14, 2019. Upon the expansion, advanced technology machines and mobile inspection equipment were procured to effectively detect drug trafficking activities. Furthermore, 38 special drug operations have been carried out in Myanmar from 2013 to 2022 in order to stop the illicit flow of precursors into Golden Triangle area as well as the trafficking of narcotic drugs from the Golden Triangle area to other regions. "Operation 1511" was carried out among the MOU member countries, resulting in significant successes in the region. Additionally, in 2022, "Operation Shan Yoma" and "Operation 1511/22" were consistently carried out in Shan State. Currently, "Operation 39" is being carried out to prevent the flow of precursors and illicit drugs throughout Myanmar from January to May of 2023.

The Controlled Chemicals Supervisory Committee, under the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control, was established in 1998. It was restructured to become the Controlled Chemicals Supervisory Sector on September 19, 2016. The Rules on the Supervision of Controlled Chemicals were promulgated on July 1, 2004 and 39 types of chemicals are prescribed as precursors. Regarding the importation of precursors, the legitimacy of the company and the purpose of importation are verified through inspection. The Pre-Export Notification (PEN) system is utilized to prevent any diversion of the chemical. However, precursors are being smuggled in various ways from neighboring countries and actions are being taken to address these issues.

According to the Opium Survey jointly conducted by UNODC and the Myanmar Government, it was revealed that there were 30,200 hectares of opium cultivation area in 2021 and 40,100 hectares in 2022, showing a 33% increase compared to 2021. Opium production rate shows that 423 tonnes were produced in 2021 and 795 tonnes in 2022, indicating an 88 percent increase compared to 2022. The surge of opium poppy cultivation occurred during the third wave of COVID-19 and an unstable period in the country.

Myanmar has been implementing an opium substitutive crop cultivation project in coordination with Mae Fah Luang Foundation in the eastern Shan State since 2012. The project covers health care services, agricultural development activities, livestock breeding, veterinary works, commercial and applied forestry works, as well as high-value product manufacturing. In addition, socio-economic surveys, study tours, capacity building training are conducted to support sustainable development activities in the country. To facilitate these initiatives, the Committee of Implementation for Alternative Development, the Ministry of Border Affairs, Myanmar and the Mae Fah Luang Foundation, Thailand, have undertaken the project. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between CCDAC and ONCB on February 10, 2022. Since 2016, the project has extended to cover 60 villages in Loilem and Ho Pong townships in Shan State (South). It is being supported by Germany and Finland, and is under the supervision of UNODC. Premium coffees produced in the project areas are exported every year to foreign countries through Malongo Coffee Company.

In order to address drug abuse problems as public health concerns, 29 drug treatment departments, and 56 treatment centers have been established. Community-based drug treatment centers have also been launched for the drug users. Additionally, Methadone Maintenance Therapy was introduced in 2006 as an alternative treatment for opiates addicts, and 86 methadone treatment centers have been opened in mental health hospitals, drug treatment hospitals, and general public hospitals. To provide recovered patients with aftercare services for a better social life, 14 rehabilitation centers have been established in Yangon, Mandalay, Myitkyina, Lashio, Keng Tung, Tachileik, Nam Latt, Myawaddy, Kawthoung, Wettikan, Pekon, Pa-an, Kalain Aung and Myeik. Educative campaigns, physical and mental rehabilitation, relocation services, and aftercare services are also being provided to encourage drug users to seek treatment.

As part of efforts to prevent drug use among the youth and students, a preventive module against drug abuse has been developed and taught in the new education curriculum. Awareness-raising activities on the dangers of drug abuse are also being taught as life skills. Additionally, out-of-school youth are being engaged and educated through out-of-school primary and secondary education programs. Organizations such as the Anti-Narcotics Association, civilian organizations, and members of the Drug Enforcement Division are conducting drug awareness campaigns and distributing educational publications in basic and higher educational institutes in regions, states, and Nay Pyi Taw Council area.

To help people learn about advocacy and avoid the dangers of narcotic drugs, five organizations, including the Department of Information and Public, Myanmar Radio and Television, News and Press Enterprises, Printing and Publishing Enterprises, and the Directorate of Public Relations and Psychological Operations, are carrying out drug awareness activities through media outreach. Drug awareness is being conducted through various media channels such as radio, television, newspapers, journals, articles, painting, cartoons, and posters.

In relation to drug law enforcement activities, Myanmar is closely cooperating with international communities including ASEAN member countries, countries in the Greater Mekong Region, BIMSTEC member countries, and neighboring countries. In addition, Myanmar collaborates with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), the Australian National Police (AFP), the US Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Narcotics Control Commission (NNCC) of China and the Office of Narcotics Control Board (ONCB), Thailand. Myanmar also alternately hosts bilateral meetings with the MoU signatory countries, such as Bangladesh, China, India, Laos, Viet Nam, and Thailand to demonstrate our commitment to drug elimination. Furthermore, countries in the Golden Triangle Region, including Myanmar, Laos, and Thailand, are continuously conducting meetings on drugs and precursors control. Along the Myanmar and China border area, there are border liaison offices, including Lwegel-Zhang Feng office, the Muse-Ruli office, the Lauk Cai-Nam sam office, and the Myitkyina-Ting Chong office. Along the Myanmar-Laos border area, there are the Wan Pong-Mai Maw office and the Wan Kyin-Keng Khote office. Along the Myanmar-Thai border area, there are the Tachileik-Mae Sai office, the Myawaddi-Mae Sot office, and the Kawthaung-Rannong office. Along the Myanmar-Bangladesh border area, there is the Maungdaw-Taknaf office, and along the Myanmar-India border area, there are Tamu-Moreh office, the Pan Saung-Chan Lan office, and the Ri-Rikawdah office. The border liaison offices are established to exchange timely information on drug related matters as well.

In line with the supervision and guidance of the Union Government, the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control remains its commitment to preventing the use of illicit drugs by utilizing all available resources and collaborating with governmental agencies, the Tatmadaw, Myanmar Police Force, Non-Governmental Organizations, civil societies, students and the public in a spirit of unity.

# Introduction

---

The hazard of drugs is a severe threat to all mankind that will destroy the entire race in the planet. Youths from all types of community around the globe have become a victim to drug abuse and if their future determination were disoriented, it will eventually slow down national development process and may threaten the health, socio-eco development, rules of law and stability of the society.

In terms of drug use, 5.5% of global population may have consumed drugs once in their lifetime and there are around 275 drug addicts around the world. Upon those figures, around 36.3 million people are in need of treatment services, and over 11 million are drug injection users. The fatalities of drug overdose have gradually increased yearly, and according to the 2021 World Drug Report, the infectious disease of HIV, Hepatitis B and C from drug abuse have overall increased as well.

Towards the prevention activities of drugs, the role of the stability of the state, the perpetual motion of the national government, and implementation of law and order are the main principal thus the illegal smuggling of precursor used in drug production process are taking place at the entry/exit point of the border area where there are little or no administration authority by the government. Moreover, the drugs produced at those borders were eventually smuggled out from the same routes that were used to smuggle precursor as well in which we are facing a great deal challenge to effectively carry out our drug law enforcement activity. As for Myanmar, the country is also a signatory to Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs 1961, Convention on Psychotropic Substances of 1971, and United Nations Convention against Illicit Trafficking in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances of 1988. And in order for Myanmar to relentlessly engage its drug law enforcement activities with the standard and norms of the conventions, notifications on narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances and precursor were declared and since then, there are now 132 narcotic drugs, 126 psychotropic substances and 39 precursors in Myanmar.

Myanmar has also formulated the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control since 1976, and after series of readjustment, CCDAC was restructured by comprising of 19 members with 21 main objectives on 21-1-2022. Furthermore, 11 working sector was organized on 17-4-2022 to be in line with the emerging era.

As part of the elimination of drug production activity, the alternative development programs were carried out by constructing roads, bridges, water irrigation, discovering energy, building houses, clinics, schools, contribution of agricultural seeds, long term plants, fertilizer, and providing livelihood vocational training camps in 55 townships density are of

poppy cultivation at Kachin state, Kayah state, Chin state, Shan state, Sagaing region and Magway region. And as to carry out livelihood activities, the government had provided small chicken, piglets, medicine for animal treatment services, conducting of educational talks on livestock breeding, capacity building trainings, and providing guidance in the protection from infectious disease of the animals in Kachin state, Kayah state, Chin state and Shan state respectively.

Furthermore in the treatment sector, examinations of HIV disease, ART medicine treatment, contribution of condoms, examination of hepatitis B/C and handing out medicine to protect from its infectious disease for drug addicts are also provided at drug treatment department and methadone centers. Likewise, 261,196 drug patients were currently treated at 29 drug treatment departments, 56 branches and 86 methadone centers. As for the rehabilitation sector, such as center-based and village-based were established under 14 rehabilitation centers. Among those centers, drug treated patients were provided physical and mental rehabilitated treatment, vocational training, and in order to persuade them back to the society, after-care treatment were given as well.

In apprehending preventive measures for youths and students on drug abuse, awareness educational lessons were included in school curriculum and drug awareness discussions were also conducted at university, college, basic education school, high school and widely including the awareness of drugs in forums, exhibitions and competitions. As for the public awareness campaign, it were included in slogans, photos exhibition, pamphlet distribution, talk shows as well as the MRTV broadcasting awareness songs, news, articles, and stories regarding drug abuse risks in English, Myanmar and ethnic language programs.

As for the law enforcement sector, Myanmar is not only utilizing its own resources but also closely cooperating with neighboring countries initiating special drug operation action plan and relentlessly carrying out drug law enforcement activities in the region. Since precursor and its related substances used in drug production process are illegally smuggled in from neighboring countries to the insecure areas to produce drugs in those areas, our officers are carrying out their duty by blocking the possible routes to inspect, interdict and take legal actions, conducting search and raid towards drug production sites, trafficking routes for drug bust, exploring opium poppy cultivation area to carry out destruction of poppy fields in which led to the arrest of 9600 offenders from 6759 drug related case by seizing narcotic drugs worth 1120 billion Kyats in 2022 by Myanmar Police Force.

All the seized drugs, precursors and its related substances that include over 2.6 ton of opium, over 1.9 ton of heroin, over 212 million of stimulant tablets, over 23.6 ton of ICE,

over 709 kg of marijuana, over 1.2 ton of speciosa, over 2 ton of ketamine, over 12 ton of caffeine, and 79 types of other drugs and precursors worth over 1188.82 billion Kyats (642.608 million US\$) were incinerated on 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022 respectively.

In order to prevent the illegal smuggling of precursors, to prevent the diversion of precursor illegal trade, Myanmar has conducted surprise check/normal inspection on 749 occasion, awareness discussion for 515 times and supervised the importation of chemical for 319 times from Yangon to other states and region, during 2022.

As for the international cooperation sector in 2022, CCDAC have overall conducted discussions/workshops on 4 occasions, 4 meetings, 2 study tour, 4 virtual discussions/workshops, 15 meetings, 1 ceremony and 1 training were attended as well.

Since the central government has been undertaking the threat of drugs by covering all sectors of law enforcement, development and healthcare with oriented-approach, I would like to take this opportunity to request all the involvement civil society, parents and youths to join hands together to eliminate the growing threat of drugs as a national duty to create a better atmosphere for the nation

## Notifications

1. The state Administration Council, Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar has reconstituted the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control step by step with 19 members and 21 duties and functions by notification order No. 25/2022 on 21st January, 2022 by exercising the powers conferred under sections 4 and 5 of the Chapter 3 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law (1993).
2. The Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control reformed and modernized with (11) working sectors by notification order No.1/2022 on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2022, by exercising the powers conferred under section 7 of Chapter 4 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law (1993).

## Holding the Destruction Ceremony of seized narcotic drugs and chemicals in Mandalay

3. In commemoration of the 35<sup>th</sup> International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, the destruction ceremony of seized narcotic drugs, chemicals and related materials was held in accordance with the COVID-19 guidelines at the former international airport, Chanmyatharzi (North) quarter, Chanmyatharzi Township, Mandalay Region at 0800 a.m. on 26th June, 2022.
4. The destruction ceremony was attended by the chairman of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control, Union Minister of Home Affairs Lieutenant General Soe Htut, Prime Minister of Mandalay region U Maung Ko and his members, Commander of Central Military Command Major General Aung Zaw Htwe, Mandalay Region Administration Council Colonel Kyaw Kyaw Min, Mandalay Region Drug Abuse Control Committee members, departmental heads of Myanmar Police Force, representatives of Mandalay Region Administration Council







and the invited guests in a total of about 600 persons. A total of 16 types of drugs and 9 types of chemicals which were seized in Mandalay division, Sagaing division, Kachin state and upper Myanmar region. The seized drugs and chemicals including 611.57 kg of Opium, 810 kg of heroin, 47 million of ATS tablets, 7356 kg of ICE, 316 kg of Ketamine and 116 kg of Cannabis worth 316.77 billion kyats (US \$ 171.23 million) were incinerated.

#### **Holding the Destruction Ceremony of the seized narcotic drugs and chemicals in Yangon**

5. In commemoration of the 35<sup>th</sup> International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, the destruction ceremony of the seized narcotic drugs, chemicals and related materials was held in accordance with the COVID-19 restriction guidelines at the Dagon Aye Yar Highway Truck Terminals, Hlaing Thar Yar (West) Township, North District of Yangon Region at 0600 a.m. on 26th June, 2022.

6. The destruction ceremony was attended by Prime Minister of Yangon region U Soe Thein and his members, Deputy Commander Brigadier General Win Myint Khaing, Union Minister of Security and Border Affairs Brigadier General Win Tint, members of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control in divisional Level, Representatives from international





organization and the invited guests in total of 445 person. The seized drugs in Yangon region, Ayeyarwaddy region, Rakhing state and lower Myanmar including 1.50 kg of Opium, 162 kg of heroin, 65 million of ATS tablets, 7599 kg of ICE, 1205 kg of Poppy Powder, 1345 kg of Ketamine, 463 kg of Cannabis in total 26 types of drugs and 7 types of Chemicals worth 356.68 billion kyats (US\$ 162.80 millions) were incinerated.

**Holding the Destruction Ceremony of seized narcotic drugs and chemicals in Taunggyi City**

7. In commemoration of the 35<sup>th</sup> International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, the destruction ceremony of the seized narcotic drugs, chemicals and related materials was held in accordance with the COVID-19 guidelines at the Ahwaiyar Balloon Ground in Taunggyi City, Shan State at 0800 a.m. on 26th June, 2022.



8. The destruction ceremony was attended by the Chairman of Shan State Administration Council Dr. Kyaw Tun, Secretary of Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control Major General Zin Min Htet Chief of the Myanmar Police Force. Chairman of the Shan State Drug Abuse Control Committee Member (1) of the Shan State Administration Council Colonel Hla Oo, Deputy Commander of East Military Command Brigadier General Win Zaw Moe, Commander of Drug Enforcement Division Police Brigadier General Win Naing, Chairman of leading groups of Self-administered Division/Regions, state level departmental heads, members of Myanmar Anti-narcotic Association (MANA), groups of national races and local people, in total of about 550 persons. The drugs and chemicals burnt were 2,041.80 kg of opium, 967 kg of heroin, 99 million stimulant tablets, 8697 kg of crystal meth, 130 kg of marijuana, 362 kg of ketamine, 12 tons of caffeine, in a total of 18 types of drugs and 40 types of chemicals. The total value of the seized narcotic drugs and chemicals incinerated was 515.36 billion kyats (US\$ 278.57 millions).



### Holding the Meeting of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control (1/2022)

9. At 1400 p.m. on 14<sup>th</sup> December 2022, the Meeting (1/2022) of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control was held in accordance with the COVID-19 guidelines at the Ahreindhamar Hall in the Myanmar Police Force Headquarters in Nay Pyi Taw and it was attended by the Chairman of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control Union Minister for Home Affairs Lieutenant General Soe Htut, Union Minister for Border Affairs Deputy General Tun Tun Naung, Joint Secretary of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control Commander



of Drug Enforcement Division Police Brigadier General Win Naing, Members of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control, chairman and secretaries of the working sectors, senior police officials of the Myanmar Police Force, delegates from relevant ministries, a total of 42 persons physically and Secretary of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control Deputy Minister of Ministry of Home Affairs Chief of Myanmar Police Force Major General Zin Min Htet, chairman, secretaries and joint secretaries of the Regions/ States Committees for Drug Abuse Control through video conferencing platform.

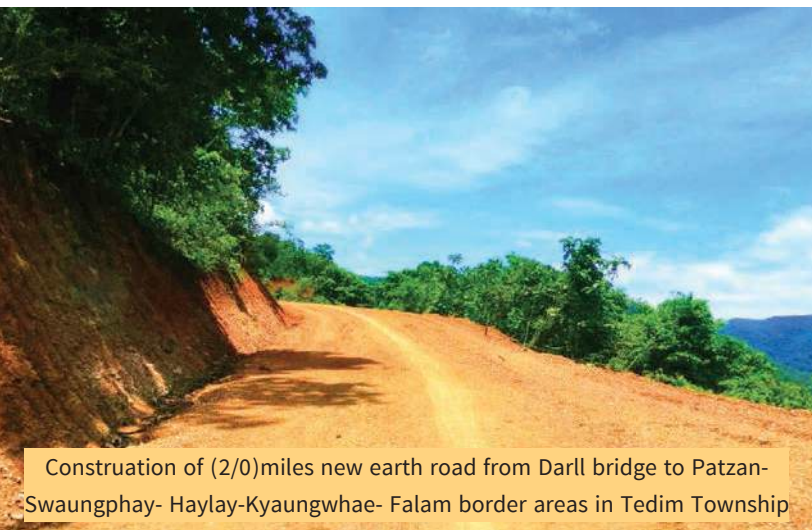

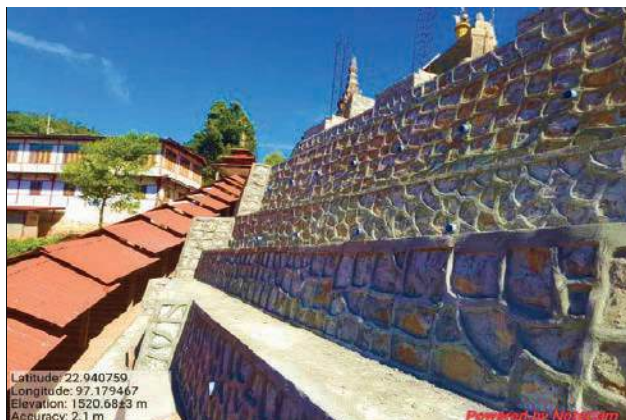

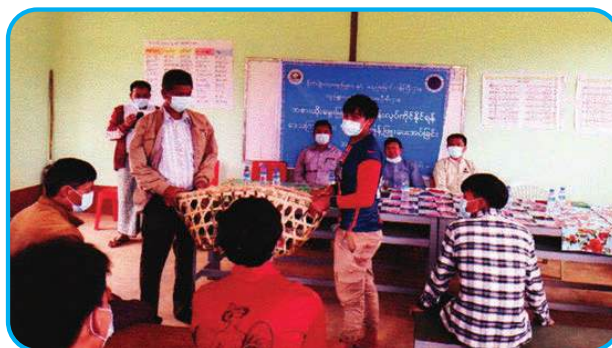

## Activities of Medical Treatment Sector

### Introduction

1. With the guidance and leadership of Central Committee of Drug Abuse Control (CCDAC), Drug Treatment Sector has been continuously and consistently endeavored in Drug Treatment and Care activities, as well as Prevention and Harm Reduction to reduce the negative consequences of drug use. Drug use remains one of the causes to hinder the development concerns and prevention and treatment of drug use disorder have the utmost important role in building the development of the sovereign state.

2. As drug use is a global problem that affects individuals, families and communities worldwide, the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 3, “Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages,” addresses this issue through SDG 3.5, which aims to “strengthen the prevention and treatment of substance abuse, including narcotic drug abuse and harmful use of alcohol.” One of the indicators for measuring progress towards this goal is indicator 3.5.1, which tracks the coverage of treatment interventions (pharmacological, psychosocial and rehabilitation and aftercare services) for substance use disorders.

3. Being a signatory to United Nations drugs conventions, Myanmar enacted “Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law (1993), and subsequently amended the law on February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2018, in response to the evolving needs and circumstances. Concurrently, Myanmar government has adopted a new approach towards drug control measures by announcing a roadmap for National Drug Control in 2016 and the National Drug Control Policy on February

20<sup>th</sup>, 2018. As outlined in the policy, the approach towards addressing the problem would be the health-oriented approach, with a focus on reducing the negative consequences of drug use being incorporated as a key component. Priority areas involved in the policy are:

- (a) Supply Reduction and Alternative Development
- (b) Demand Reduction and Harm Reduction
- (c) International Cooperation
- (d) Research and Analysis
- (e) Compliance with Human Rights

4. In accordance with the amendment of 1993 Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law, Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control established committees for specific sectors and the drug treatment sector being formed as follows:

### HIV prevention and Harm Reduction

6. People who inject drugs (PWID) and people who use drugs (PWUD) are provided with harm reduction services, including HIV testing service (HTS), anti-retroviral therapy (ART), condom distribution for PWID, PWUD and their partners, Hepatitis B and C testing and Hepatitis B vaccination, diagnosis and treatment of tuberculosis, and diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted infections at drug treatment centers and methadone clinics. Harm reduction activities were implemented with the partner organizations: AHRN, MANA, MDM, SARA and Metta.

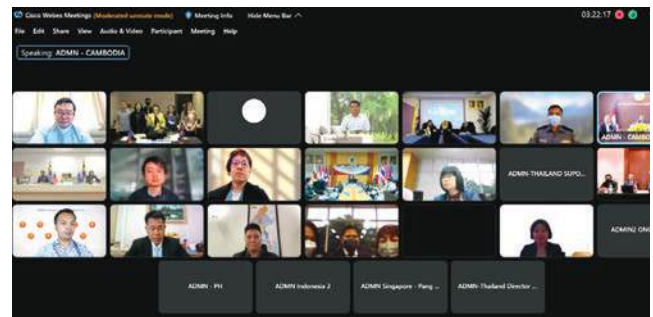


## International Cooperation

## Activities of Rehabilitation Sector

### Formulation of the Rehabilitation Working Committee

1. Rehabilitation Working Committee had been organized in 1980. According to the order No 3/2016 date on (19.9.2016), it was reformed with the Chairman, Deputy Minister from Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief and resettlement and the members, Director General from General administration Department, Director General from Department of Small Scale Industry, Director General from Department of labor, Director General from Department of Technical and Vocational Education, Director General from Department of Medical Services, Head of Department from Myanmar Police Force and the Secretary, Director General from Department of Rehabilitation.

### Objectives

2. The Department of Rehabilitation has opened the Social Rehabilitation Centers with the following objectives:

- (a) To carry out the mindset improvement of the ex-drug users,
- (b) To train the ex-drug users to have a good relationship with their communities, to train the physical development of the ex-drug users, to provide the suitable vocational training, and to train the ex-drug users to be part of the labour force through their accomplished vocational skills.





### Implementation

3. The Department of Rehabilitation has been implementing the rehabilitation services in accord with the three following Strategies:

- (a) Center Based Rehabilitation,
- (b) Semi-Community Based Rehabilitation,
- (c) Community Based Rehabilitation.

### Center Based Rehabilitation

4. The Department of Rehabilitation run by in total (14) centers. They are:

- (a) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Yangon) in Yangon Region
- (b) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Mandalay) in Mandalay Region
- (c) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Myitkyina) in Kachin State
- (d) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Lashio) in Northern Shan State
- (e) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Kyaingtone) in Eastern Shan State
- (f) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Tachileik) in Eastern Shan State
- (g) Drug Rehabilitation Center for Ex Drug Users (Namlat) in Southern Shan State

6. Conducting Rehabilitation Services at the Centers: From January to December 2022 (20) trainees in Wathhteekan Drug Rehabilitation Center, (40) trainees in Lashio Drug Rehabilitation Center, (20) trainees in Nanlatt Drug Rehabilitation Center, have been rehabilitated. There was a total of (80) rehabilitated trainees.

7. Conducting Community Based Rehabilitation Services at community: From January to December 2022 in Myitkyina Township, Kachin State (30) trainees have been rehabilitated. There was a total of (30) rehabilitated trainees.

8. Conducting Volunteer Social Worker Training: From January to December 2022 (20) trainees in Yangon Drug Rehabilitation Center, (20) trainees in Mandalay Drug Rehabilitation Center, (20) trainees in Myawaddy Drug Rehabilitation Center, (20) trainees in Wathteekan Drug Rehabilitation Center, have been rehabilitated. There was a total of (80) rehabilitated trainees.

9. The following Vocational Trainings are provided to the Center Based Rehabilitation Training and Community Based Rehabilitation Training:

- (a) Soap Liquid Production
- (b) Silk-Screen Printing
- (c) Bricking
- (d) Hair Cutting
- (e) Basic Motor-Cycle repairing
- (f) Basic Motor-Car repairing
- (g) Agriculture

### Conducting Educational Lectures

10. Anti-drug talks on drug dangers to humanity were conducted for a total of 9,222 students in 70 schools in the Nay Pyi Taw Union Territory Area and other states and regions.



### Attending Meetings, Workshops at home and Abroad

11. An online coordination meeting with voluntary drug supervisors who are providing follow-up services for ex-drug addicts was held at the Rehabilitation Department meeting room on 30.3.2022.

12. To develop a draft standardized working guide book for Ex-Drug Addicts Rehabilitation centers, a coordination meeting of a technical team of 23 representatives from relevant



departments was conducted in the Rehabilitation Department meeting room from 27.5.2022 to 3.8.2022. On September 20,2022, a presentation of a standardized working guide book was made in order to obtain the Union Minister's approval. With the permission of the Union Minister, the working guide book was distributed to the Ex-Drug Rehabilitation Centers on November 2, 2012.

13. The video recording of the song "The Repentance of the Inheritance of Evil," composed by the trainees from the rehabilitation center for ex-drug addicts (Myitkyina), was conducted from 27.5.2022 to 29.5.2022 in the rehabilitation camp for ex-drug addicts (Wethikan), Bago Region. The song "The Repentance of the Inheritance of Evil" is to raise awareness about the dangers of drugs. It has been carried out by the Ministry of Social Welfare, Relief, and Resettlement, the Department of Rehabilitation, and Myanmar Voice and Television, and is now being broadcast regularly on Myanmar Voice and Television.

14. Capacity Building Training for the Rehabilitation Department's staff on drug addiction rehabilitation was able to provide training to 57 participants from August 29, 2022 to September 2, 2022.

15. The rehabilitation team coordination meeting (1/2022) of the central organization for the prevention of drugs and psychotropic substances was held on October 21, 2022, at the meeting hall of the rehabilitation department.

### **Implementing the Project Activities**

16. After implementing plan of drug eradication in 1999, (190) trainees have been provided the rehabilitation services as acts of reducing the drug using: Center Based Rehabilitation services, Semi-Community Based Rehabilitation services, Community Based Rehabilitation services and Volunteer Social Worker services in 2022.

### **Budget Allocation**

17. The Department of Rehabilitation spent Ks 25,400,100/-from January to December 2022.

### **Conclusion**

18. Department of Rehabilitation continues to carry out rehabilitation services hand in hand with the related Departments, the people, non-government organization and international non-government organization in implementing reintegration and rehabilitation activities of National Drug Control policy prescribed by The Republic of the Union of Myanmar according to the strategies of rehabilitation service.

## Activities of Community Service Supervision Sector

1. The Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law was amended by the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw Law No. 6 in Feb, 2018. According to the amendment, the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control notified to organize the Social Benefit Supervision Committee with the Notification No. 1/2020 on (3-2-2020) in an accord with the Section 7 (k) of this Law.
2. The Social Benefit Supervision Committee is led by Deputy Minister of the Office of the Union Government as the Chairman; Director General of General Administration Department as the Secretary; with members from other 8 departments.
3. The first meeting of the Social Benefit Supervision Committee was held on 10th March, 2020. According to the meeting minutes, the establishment of the Social Benefit Supervision Committee in all administrative tiers is being conducted by the approval of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control.
4. As the General Administration Department was moved under the Ministry of the Home Affairs from the Ministry of the Office of the Union Government by notification No. 119/2021 of State Administration Council on 5th May, 2021, the reformation of the Social Benefit Supervision Committee is still under process.
5. Since the different levels of the Social Benefit Supervision Committee at Nay Pyi Taw, Regions/States were formed during the term of previous government and so the members of the concerned boards had already changed. With regard this, reformation of the different levels of the Social Benefit Supervision Committee in accordance with the current formation is undergoing process and reformation of township level board, included Parliamentary Representatives, due to lack of Parliamentary Representatives at present is doing so.
6. As the activity of the Social Benefit Supervision Committee, different levels of Social Benefit Supervision Committee had been already formed in Nay Pyi Taw, 15 Regions/ States, 325 Townships and 16135 Wards / Villages Tracts up to December 2022.

## Activities of the Students and Youths Education Sector

### Introduction

1. The government of the Republic of Myanmar has established the prevention of drug abuse and psychoactive substances as a national responsibility. Ministry of Education which is a working group of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control is implementing as The Committee for Educating Students and Youths. This Committee is carrying out educating and teaching for young students with Life skills and Morals and Civics, Physical Education, Aesthetic Education in Basic Education Curriculum. Non-Formal Primary Education (NFPE) and Non-Formal Middle Education (NFME) programs are being linked and taught the drug abuse knowledge for out-of-school children.
2. For “drug-free school environment” in Basic Education schools, universities, degree colleges and Colleges, we are conducting to be drug free within 100 yards of schools and talks show as the educating activities, competing art, cartoon, poster, essay and demonstration of role plays and distributing pamphlets.

### Objectives

3. Objectives are as follow:
  - (a) To promote awareness that “Prevention is better than Cure”,
  - (b) To distribute knowledge about the risks of narcotic drugs and substances abuse through Life Skills in Universities, Degree Colleges, Colleges, Basic Education schools and Non-Formal education centres,
  - (c) To acquire the knowledge and skills related to the prevention of drug abuse so that they can be reused in the real life situation of students and youths.

## Developing Curriculum and teaching for drug abuse prevention

4. Ministry of Education is updating and developing Basic Education Curricula and lessons for the prevention of drug abuse and psychoactive substances are also included in Life Skills subject and it is linked with Physical Education, Aesthetic Education, Morals and Civics subjects.

5. Teaching this curricula which includes the prevention of drug abuse and psychoactive substances can assist students to know the risks of addictive drugs, to know the negative effects of drug use, to protect yourself and know the risks about common diseases, to know that drug use can affect a young person's goals, to avoid drug abuse and psychoactive substances by realizing the disadvantages of drug abuse and psychoactive substances, to nurture a healthy mind and body by increasing the health knowledge, to develop the self-confidence and survival skills and to develop skills needed for the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Doing practical works, reviewing their actions, reporting back, recommending and reviewing each other, sharing with family members have been implemented to acquire knowledge of drug prevention, skills and attitude.

### School-Based Activities

6. In 2022-2023 academic year, we were able to distribute pamphlets such as "Positive parenting helps prevent drug use" and "What is methamphetamine" written by the Department of drug addiction, Ministry of Health to use in drug abuse prevention awareness activities in basic education schools in States and Regions.



7. Total Schools (173) such as (29) High schools, (71) Middle schools and (73) Primary schools had been upgraded to assist the prevention of drug abuse in the townships where poppy cultivation is being eradicated.

8. School improvement funds were provided to 110, 836 students from Basic Education Schools, monastic schools and educational training schools as follows:

9. In June, 2022, we were able to appoint 61 Teaching Assistants and 3 Language Teachers for local development activities in 16 of the 55 townships where opium cultivation was carried out.

10. Constructions of classrooms, staff housing, and libraries, science equipment and furniture were provided in places where opium substitute development is being carried out. Computers, teaching and learning materials included in the curriculum were provided and carried out exhibition competitions and drug-free activities around the school in Basic Education Schools.

11. The Department of Basic Education serves as a member of the alternative development and implementation management of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control. Schools in the (55) townships of Shan State (north) with opium cultivation are earmarked for each fiscal year with state funds.

12. Ministry of Education has designated for students regarding to the non-use of drugs in non-formal primary education (NFPE) and non-formal middle education (NFME) learning sites within a distance of approximately (100) yards, conducting and learning lessons and activities in NFPE, NFME curricula that also include subjects related to the risk of drug abuse cooperation with the respective ward/village administrators who are conducting these education activities, Township Education Officers from the Department of Basic Education, principals and supervisors from implementing NFPE and NFME States and Regions, Township supervisors and teachers.



### Non-Formal Education (NFE) Activities

13. On page 137, Teacher's Guide of the Life Skills from the general study of non-formal primary education, the lesson 'can be replaced' is taught for 30 minutes. The general study picture cards (30) of non-formal primary education (NFPE) Level 1 are co-taught with the story "The further the better" from the betel nut and tobacco lesson. We are educating together the story books 'I know what I did wrong' and 'Think of something else' from Level 1 General subject Reading Cards (33) 'Do you know me?'. There are (2) periods of teaching, and (1) period is taught for 30 minutes.

### Non Formal Middle Education (NFME)

14. In life skills (QL-101) subject of non-formal middle education, 'What's next?' 'The further the better', 'Don't try it'; 'What good is there?' and in (QL-102) subject, Drug and HIV in the field of drug prevention, 'causes carelessness'; "abuse" are being taught with the topics of 'can be replaced'.

15. In 2022-2023 academic year, the universities, degree colleges and colleges Periodic inspection and supervision by the school canteen supervision committee to prevent the sale of drugs and food products made with cannabis in the restaurants inside the school premises. Placing awareness advertisements, local police officers connect with parents and check, information acquisition and prevention were carried out.

16. Moreover, distributing educational vinyls related risks of drugs, sharing knowledge about the risks of drugs in Fresher Welcome party and homage paying ceremony, celebrating talk shows, wall paper, essay competitions, presenting role-plays in universities, degree colleges, colleges are conducted by respective departments and organizations.

17. As Myanmar Education Channel is being broadcast a 7-priorities program, "reducing and eradication of the risk and danger of Narcotic Drugs" is the 1<sup>st</sup> priority and being transmitted weekly awareness programs, articles, and songs.

18. Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking Prevention talk shows and competitions of essay, poem, cartoon, painting, mottos, and poster were held in universities, degree colleges, colleges, basic education schools and centers, and prizes were awarded to students. # Chapter - 4

## Drug Law Enforcement

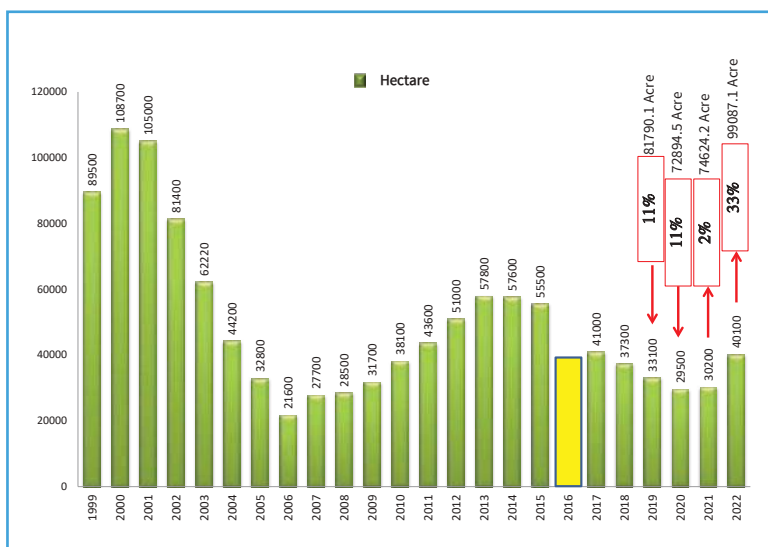




## Activities of Drug Law Enforcement

1. Opium poppy cultivations took place in the regions of far-reaching from the governance, and in the regions of difficult transportations, less development, security instability, and remote and hilly regions in Myanmar. Opium poppies are cultivated mostly in Shan State, and it was also found in Sagaing Region, Magwe Region, Kachin State, Chin State and Kayah State.

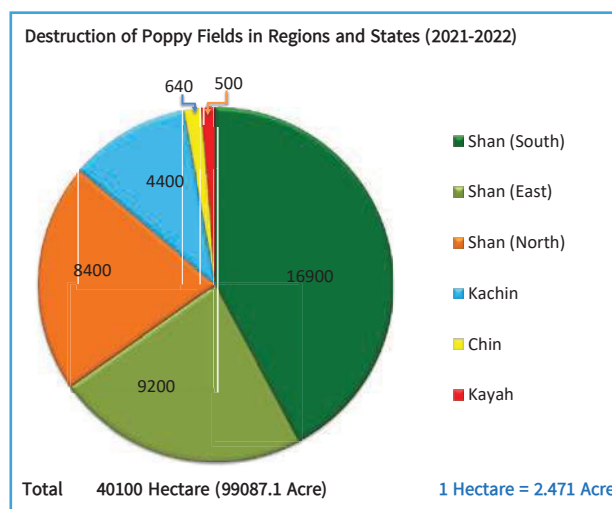
2. Since the CCDAC and UNODC jointly conducted the opium cultivation survey, the total area under cultivation was, in 2012-2013 poppy-cultivation season, 57800 hectares of poppy cultivation took place in the country and 12257.46 hectares were destroyed, and in 2013-2014 poppy-cultivation season, 57600 hectares of poppy-cultivation took place in the country and 15188.49 hectares were destroyed, and in 2014-2015 poppy-cultivation season, 55500 hectares of opium cultivation took place in the country and 13274.97 hectares were destroyed. In 2015-2016 poppy-cultivation season, the poppy-cultivation survey could not be conducted and 7562.79 hectares of poppy fields were destroyed. In 2016-2017 poppy-cultivation season, 41000 hectares of opium cultivation took place and 3536.96 hectares were destroyed. In 2017-2018 poppy-cultivation season, 37300 hectares of opium cultivation took place and 2578.53 hectares were destroyed. In 2018-2019 poppy-cultivation season, 33100 hectares of opium cultivation took place and 2459.91 hectares were destroyed. In 2019-2020 poppy-cultivation season, 29500 hectares of opium cultivation took place and 2026.58 hectares of opium cultivation were destroyed. In 2020-2021 poppy-cultivation season, 30200 hectares of opium cultivation took place and 3632.97 hectares of opium cultivation were destroyed. In 2021-2022 poppy-cultivation season, 40100 hectares of opium cultivation took place and 1403.27 hectares of opium cultivation



were destroyed. In 2021, 30200 hectares of opium cultivation took place and in 2022, 4010 hectares of opium cultivation took place. Therefore, 33 % of opium cultivation was increased in 2022 than the year 2021.

3. The opium production was decreased to over 2% than 2018 with 520 metric tons of opium had been produced in 2018 and 508 metric tons

in 2019. The opium production was decreased to over 20% than 2019, with 405 metric tons of opium had been produced in 2020. In 2021, 423 metric tons was produced. Therefore, 4% of production was increased than 2020. In 2022, 790 metric tons was produced and 80 % production was increased than 202. It was learnt that on each region of poppy-cultivation that in 2021-2022, over 86% of poppy cultivation of the whole country was in Shan State, 11 % in Kachin State, 1.5 % each in Chin State and Kayah State.



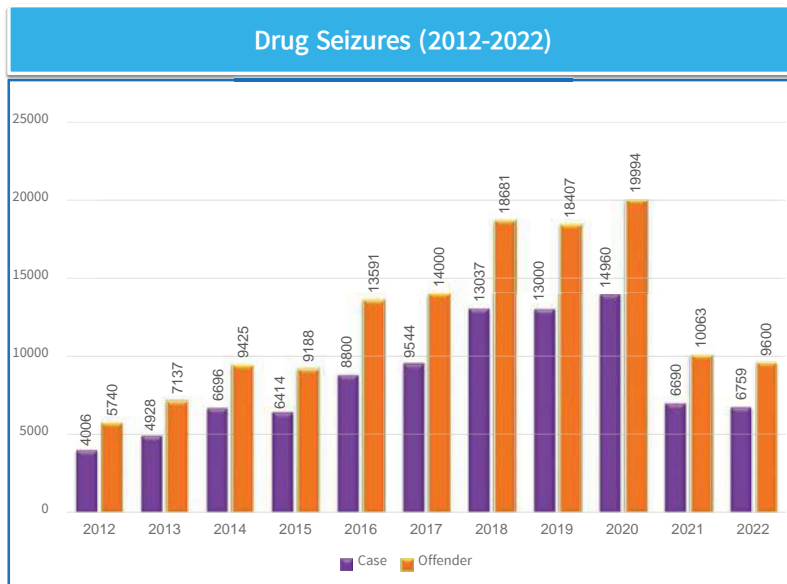
4. Since the chemicals and related materials which are the main raw materials for the production of narcotic drugs can not be produced in Myanmar and they are smuggled into Myanmar in different ways from the neighboring countries. In Myanmar, Tatmadaw (Army), Myanmar Police Force and Customs Department have been playing a key role on the works of drug law enforcement and suppression. In 2022, in a total of 6759 cases and 9600 offenders, 101 cases of opium; over 1209.77 kg, 1118 cases of heroin; more than 1345.49 kg, 4439 cases of stimulant tablets; 169070909 tablets, 175 cases of Ice; 23401.92 kg, 408 cases of marijuana; 92943 kg, 16 cases of solidified opium oil; 163.03 kg, 47 cases of *Matrigyna speciosa* powder; 766.48 kg, 61 cases of Ecstasy tablets; 674542 Ecstasy tablets, 1 case of Tramadol capsules; 55 capsules, 51 cases of Ketamine; 2328.63 kg, 5 cases of Caffeine; 9036.01 kg, 3 cases of Sulfuric Acid; 22550 liters, 2 case2 of Hydrochloric Acid; 9200 liters, 6460 liters of Acetone; 7 cases of Toulene; 41910 liters, 7 cases of Sodium Acetate; 12425 kg, 3 cases of Sodium Cyanide; 15400 kg and other chemicals, related materials, arms and ammunition together with 285 motorcars, 132 cargo vehicles, 15 passenger buses, 36 Taxi cars, 2 motorboats, 3 oil tankers, 5 three wheel motorcycles, 948 motorcycles, 15 cycles, 1484 hundredthousand kyats, 104 US \$ and 3710 Thai Baht, foreign offenders and offenders from different layers of society arrested were as follow:

- (a) Drug seizures including arms and ammunition; In 2022, the seized arms and ammunition were 5 revolvers, 76 pistols, 94 long guns, 20 barrel guns, 5 12-volt barrel guns, 1 RPG, 3 Tumi guns, 2 local made guns, 3 air guns, 2 gas guns, 29 40-mm bomb-heads,, 10 RPG missiles, 10 RPG bullets, 18 grenades, 36181 bullets of various types, 366 various cartridges, 71120 Detonators,

1 landmine, 16 related materials were seized from a total of 56 cases of narcotic drugs and other cases.

- (b) Arrest of foreigner who committed the drug crime; In 2022, as the arrests of foreigners who committed the drug crimes were 2 Chinese citizen<sup>2</sup> in 2 cases, 18 Thai citizens in 13 cases, a total of 20 offenders from foreign countries in 15 cases in total were arrested.
- (c) Arrests of offenders from different layers of society; In 2022, among the drug seizures in Myanmar, 119 youths under 18 year old, 2 persons from ethnic armed groups, 1 student/youth, 14 civil servants, 3 policemen, 13 Tatmadaw men (soldiers), 13 monks, 6 prisoners, 20 foreigners, a total of 191 offenders were taken into action.

5. With reference to the case study of raw opium seizures arrested in 2022, it was found out that the largest raw poppy cultivation area with 49.2 % of the seizures of the whole country is in Shan State, 25.05 % in Mandalay Region, 25.33 % in Kachin State, 0.13 % in Sagaing Region, 0.09% in Chin State, 0.23 % in Magwe Region and 0.0021% in Yangon Region were arrested.



6. According to the case study of the heroin seizures in 2022, heroin production was largely taken place in the Shan State with 43.56% of the seizures in the whole country, 36.93 % in Mandalay Region, 13.08 % in Kachin State, 0.52% in Mon State, 3.43 % in Sagaing Region, 0.024% in Magwe Region, 0.0071% Nay Pyi Taw Union area, 0.00087% in Chin State, 2.42% in Yangon Region, 0.00067 % in Bago Region and 0.0024% in Ayarwaddy Region were

seized and it was trafficked secretly from Shan State which is the largest heroin production through Mandalay Region and Sagaing Region to Kachin State and to India, from Tachileik in Shan State (East) to Thailand, from Myawaddy in Kayin state to Thailand and through Tachileik-Wampon to Laos.

7. With reference to the case study of the seizures of stimulant tablets in 2022, it was found out scrutinized that the stimulant tablets were produced largely on the China- Myanmar border areas in Shan State and Thailand- Myanmar border areas. They are trafficked in domestic and to abroad by using different patterns and ways and besides they were transported to Thailand via Tachileik and and Mingsat Townships ,Shan State (East), and also diverted the routes across inland to Thailand via Myawaddy Township in Kayin State. Moreover, it was observed that the stimulant tablets from Shan State (South) and Shan State (North) were transported to Sittwe and Maung Taw Townships through Magwe Region and Yangon Region, and then from there, to Bangladesh were transported and trafficked. There was also more transported and trafficked by sea to Malaysia. During 2022, there were 38.8% in Shan State; 25.02% in Mandalay Region; 16.35% in Yangon Region; 11.47% in Rakhine State; 1.63% in Bago Region; 0.74% in Kayin State; 1.72% in Tanintharyi Region; 0.14% in Magway Region; 0.32% in Mon State; 3.24% in Kachin State; 0.28% in Sagaing Region; 0.029% in Ayeyarwady Region; 0.01% in Kayah State and 0.17% were arrested in Nay Pyi Taw Union Area were seized.

8. With reference to the case study of seizures of Ice in 2022, Ice produced from Shan State was illegally transported to Thailand and Laos via Shan State (East); through Karen State and Mon State across inland to Thailand; and to Malaysia by using sae routes, it was observed that. In 2022, according to the cases of Ice seizures, 32.8% of the whole country seizures were in Mandalay Region Shan State; 25.13% in Mon State; 22.71% in Shan State, 9.45 % in Karen State, 4.37% in Tanintharyi Region; 4.27% in Rakhine State , 0.17% in Yangon Region, 0.04% in Chin State, 0.008% Nay Pyi Taw Union Area, 0.008 % in Bago Region, 0.009 % in Kachin State, 0.00003 % in Ayarwaddy Region and 0.000001% in Magwe Region were seized.

9. The largest seizures of Caffeine which are mainly contained with 70% as chemicals in the production of stimulant tablets were found along the border areas in the east of Myanmar, Thailand and Laos. Due to the result of Caffeine-seizures, production of stimulant tablets was able to control at a certain scale effectively. Import of Ephedrine (or) Pseudoephedrine tablets which is the main precursor for the production of Ice become decreasing and then it was analysed according to the seizures of chemicals that the ephedrine have been producing by preparing through the chemicals which are not controlled.



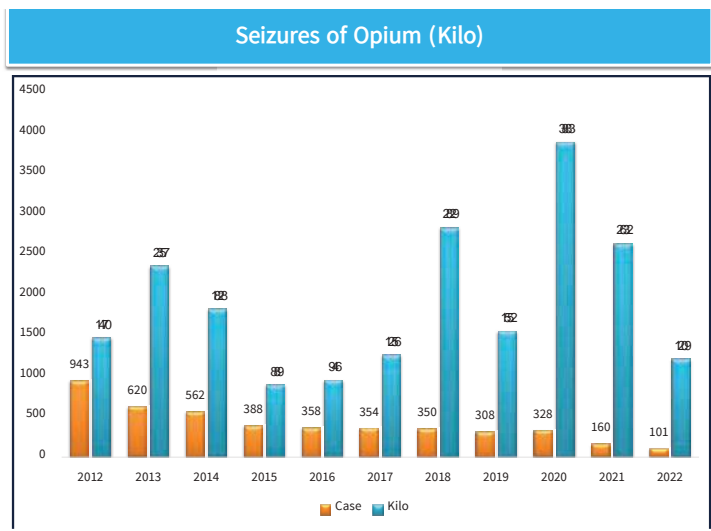
10. Since the P2P which is the main raw material for the production of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances are controlled from the multiple sites, and the narcotic drug producers use the Sodium Cyanide to produce P2P, they are smuggled illegally into Myanmar. Therefore, in 2018, 23550 kg of Sodium Cyanide and 4640 kg were seized in 2019, 107870 kg in 2020, and 48620 kg in 2021, 15400 kg in 2022 and according to the seizures in 2022, as the nation-wide, those of 46.42 % in Mandalay Region and 44.80 % in Shan State and 8.77% in Yangon Region were seized.

11. In 2022, a total of 9600 offenders of 6759 drug-cases were arrested and taken into legal actions and in 2021, a total of 100634 offenders of 6990 drug-cases were arrested and taken into legal actions. Therefore, 231 cases and 463 offenders in total decreased than 2021 and a value of 150.072 billion of drugs seized was decreased than 2021. As it was found that in 2022, a total of 1118 heroin seizure cases, 4439 seizure cases of stimulant tablets could be made as 16.54% off seizures of narcotic drugs for heroin and as 65.67% off the seizures of stimulant tablets were found.

12. In undertaking the drug law enforcement works, 10 Drug Enforcement Sub-Divisions, 1 X-Ray Machine Sub-Division, 54 Anti-Narcotic Units, 4 X-Ray Machine Units, 120 gazetted-officers and 1018 non-gazetted officers, a total of 1138 persons have been undertaking the works of drug law enforcement.

**Seizures of opium/ brown opium powder**

13. In 2022, 1209.77074 kg of opium in 101 cases and there was 61.03 f brown opium powder in 1 seizure case and in 2021, 2632.00975 kg of raw opium in 160 cases were seized, and there was no seizure of brown opium powder. Therefore, the seizures of opium



in 2022 was learnt that 59 cases of opium seizures; weight of over 1422.23901 kg were seized decreasingly than the year 2021.

14. In 2022, for the seizures of opium in Regions/ States, there were 595.31513 kg of opium in 52 cases in the whole Shan State, 303.06 kg in 4 cases in Mandalay Region, 306.5141 kg of opium in 31 cases in Kachin Stat, 1.668 kg of opium in 2 cases in the Sagaing Region, 0.11 kg in 2 cases in Chin State, 2.83851 kg in 10 cases in Magway Region and 0.265 kg in Yangon Region were arrested.

15. In 2022, the significant seizures over 50 kg of opium were that 180 kilos of opium in Kulong Township on 5-3-2022, 63 kilos of opium on 11-6-2022 in Tharsi Township, 176.4 kilos of opium on 2-8-2022, and on 9-7-2022, 125 kilos of opium and 16.72 kilos of heroin in Mohnyin Township. 78 kilos of opium on 16-9-2022, on 24-11-2022 in Namsan Township, 60 kilos of brown poppy powder were seized.

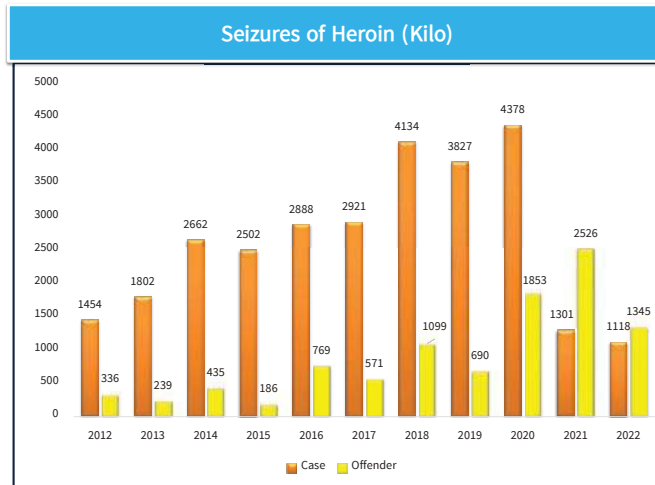

#### **Seizures of Heroin**

17. Since 1345.498148 kg of heroin were seized in 1118 cases in 2022 and 2526.109114 kg of heroin in 1301 cases in 2021, and it was found that 183 cases arrested decreased and over 1180.61 kg of heroin were seized decreasingly in 2022 than 2021.

18. In 2022, as the heroin seizures in region/state, there were seized 586.144639 kgs of heroin in 210 cases in Shan State, 496.92407 kgs in 123 cases in Mandalay Region, 176.0378021 kg in 520 cases in Kachin State, 46.235051 kg in 204 cases in Sagaing Region, 7 kgs in 1 case in Mon State, 32.67098 kgs in 40 cases in Yangon Region, 0.095996 kg in 10 cases in the Union Territory of Nay Pyi Taw, 0.0118 kg in 3 cases in Chin State; 0.336 kg in 2 cases in Magway Region, 0.03276 kg in 2 cases in Ayawaddy Region and 0.00905 kg in 3 cases in Bago Region.



19. During the year 2022, the seizures more than 20 kilos of heroin were that 39.38 kilos of heroin seized in Loilin Township on 3-1-2022, on 11-1-2022, 30.8 kilos of heroin and 22800 stimulant tablets in Pyin Oo Lwin Township, on 24-1-2022, 80.52 kilos of heroin and 228,000 stimulant tablets, on 14-6-2022, 20.9 kilos of heroin and 4.8 lakh of stimulant tablets, on 20-6-2022, 28.6 kilos of heroin and 4.8 lakhs of stimulant tablets, on 20-6-2022, 31.9 kilos of heroin and according to the connection uncovered, 1.6 lakhs stimulant tablets and 17.5 lakh pseudoephedrine tablet were seized in Mandalay, 44 kilos of heroin on 22-9-2022, 44 kilos of heroin, in Naung Cho Township on 1-2-2022, 44 kilos of heroin on 17-5-2022, 21.6 kilos of heroin, on 3-6-2022, 88 kilos of heroin on 17-6-2022 in Lashio Township, on 16-5-2022, 26.4 kg of heroin and 3.42 lakhs of stimulant tablets in Moehnyin Township, 24.42 kilos of heroin, on 25-8-2022, 10.8 lakh of stimulant tablets and 33 kilos of opium, on 22-5-2022 in Kunhein Township, 23.31 kilos of heroin, 23.976 kilos of heroin on 24-7-2022, 29.7 kilos of heroin on 23-5-2022 in Pharkant Township, on 25-5-2022 in Patheingyi Township, 33 kilos of heroin and arms and ammunition, on 10-6-2022, 40.7 kilos of heroin and 400,000 stimulant tablets in Taunggyi Township, 21.78 kilos of heroin on 14-6-2022 in Monywa town, 60 blocks of heroin; 21 kg weight on 10-7-2022 in Muse Town. On 17-7-2022 in Theinni Township, 116 blocks of heroin; 40.6 kg weight, on 20-7-2022, 77.52 kilos of heroin in Yamaethin Township, and 44 kilos of heroin in Thipaw Township on 16-9-2022.

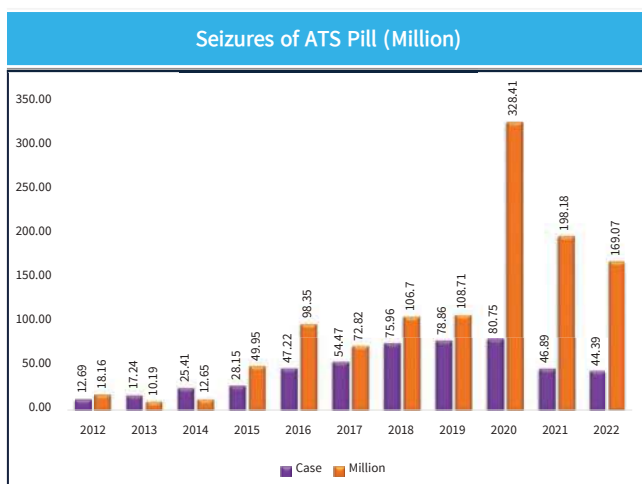
### Seizures of stimulant tablets

21. A total of over 169.07 million of stimulant tablets in 4439 cases were seized in 2022 and over 198.188 millions stimulant tablets in 4689 cases were seized in 2021. Therefore, it was found that the seizures of stimulant tablets in 2022 decreased about 29.188 million and 250 cases than the seizures in 2021.

22. In 2022, as the seizures of stimulant tablets in regions and states, over 65.607 millions of stimulant tablets in 1032 cases in Shan State, over 42.31million of stimulant tablets in 366 cases in Mandalay Region, more than 27.65 million stimulant tablets in 496 cases in Yangon Region, over 19.4 million stimulant tablets in 158 cases in Rakhine State, over 2.77 million stimulant tablets in 194 cases in Bago Region, over 12.6 million stimulant tablets in 439cases in Kayin State, more than 2.91 million stimulant tablets 580 cases in Tanintharyi Region, more than 0.24 million stimulant tablets in 43 cases in Magway Region, more than 0.55 million stimulant tablets in 624 cases in Mon State, more than 5.49 million stimulant tablets in 189 cases in Kachin State, more than 0.017 million stimulant tablets in 30 cases in Kayah State, more than 0.48 million stimulant tablets in 82 cases in Sagaing Region, more than 0.049 million stimulant tablets in 119 cases in Ayeyarwady Region and over 0.28 million stimulant tablets in 87 cases in Nay Pyi Taw Union Territory were arrested.

Weapons and ammunition, on 24-4-2022, in Tachilek Township. 2.0358 millions of stimulant tablets, on 9-8-2022, in Moe Nying Township, 1.438 millions of stimulant tablets in Pinlong Township on 8-11-2022, on 9-11-2022, 1.77 millions of stimulant tablets in Kon Hein Township and 1.34 millions of stimulant tablets and 2 kilos of Ice in Waw Township on 21-11-2022.

25. 23401.9198 kg of Ice in 175 cases were seized in 2022 and 13815.77542 kg of Ice in 126 cases were seized in 2021. Therefore, it was found that the situation on the seizures of Ice in 2022 increased more 9586.14438 kg and 49 cases than the seizures in 2021.

26. In 2022, as the seizures of Ice in regions and states, 7677.5342 kg in 14 cases in the Mandalay region, ; 5881.46493 kg in 14 cases in Mon State, 5316.4158 kg in 41 cases in in Shan State, 2213.745 kilos in 7 cases in Kayin State, 1023.54878 kg in 63 cases in Tanintharyi Region, 1000.08425 kg in 6 cases in Rakhine state, 275.32168 kg in 26 cases in Yangon

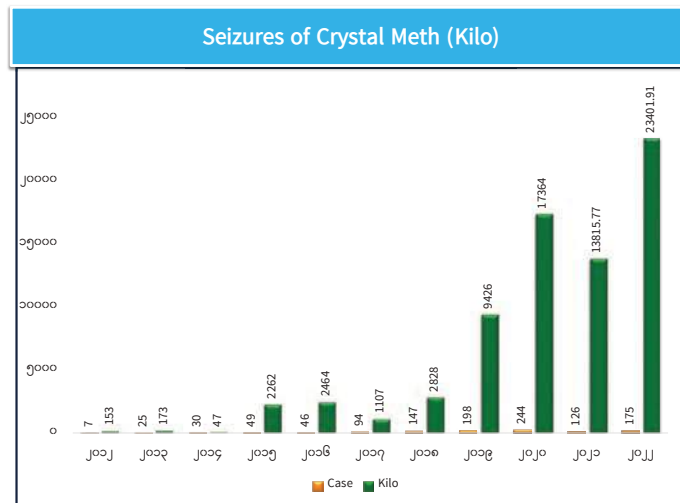

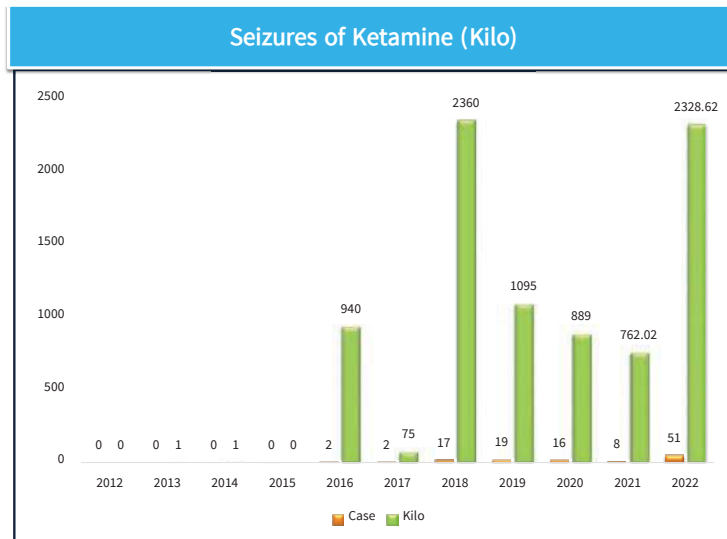

### Seizures of Ketamine

29. A total of 2328.62422 kgs of Ketamine in 51 cases were seized in 2022 and a total of 762.0212 kg of Ketamine in 8 cases were seized in 2021. Therefore, it was found that the situation on the seizures of Ketamine; 1566.60302 kg of Ketamine and 43 cases in 2022 increased more than 2021.

30. In 2022, as the seizures of in regions and states, 1098.00322 kg in 1 case in Mon State, 138.1985kg. in 2 cases in Mandalay Region, 1079.995 kgs in 25 cases in Shan State, 7.6332 kg 14 cases in Yangon Region, 4.7106 kg in 6 cases in Karen State, 0.0685 kg in 2 cases in Nay Pyi Taw Union Territory, 0.0142 kg in 1 case in Tanintharyi Region and 0.001 kg in Kachin State were seized.

31. During the year 2022, the significant seizures of Ketamine were 1238 kilos of Ice and 111 kilos of Ketamine in Amarapura Township on 3-3-2022, 185 kilos of Ketamine in Pinlaung Township on 9-3-2022, 997 kilos of Ice and 798 kilos of Ketamine, on 11-3-2022, and on 20-6-2022, 1700 kg of Ice and 300 kg of Ketamine in Kyaikhto Township.

### Seizures of Ephedrine / Pseudo-ephedrine tablets

33. The Ephedrine and Pseudo-ephedrine tablets which was the main chemical ingredient in production of stimulant drugs, in 2022, 30.5 15 hundred-thousand tablets of Pseudo-ephedrine in 2 cases and 1 kg of Ephedrine in case and, but there were no seizures in 2021, drug manufacturers are reusing Ephedrine to produce drugs, according to the cases of arrests.

34. According to the seizure cases, it was observed that the production areas and trafficking routes of Ephedrine / Pseudo-ephedrine were found as follow:

- (a) From Kalay in Sagaing Region- Tant Sel – Yay Oo- Shwe Bo- Sagaing- MANDalay.
- (b) From Tamu in India- Kham Pat- Kalaywa- Gant Gaw- Min Ywar- Sagaing- Mandalay.

### **Seizures of controlled chemicals**

35. In Myanmar, since 28 types of chemicals which are essential in the production of drugs were previously controlled, it was found according to the seizures cases that the illicit drug producers imported the chemicals which are not controlled and transported illegally instead of the controlled chemicals and they have been using these chemicals after changing and processing. Therefore, the 63<sup>rd</sup> United Nations Special Meeting on Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND) has added a total of 11 controlled chemicals since May 26, 2021, adding a total of 11 controlled chemicals to Myanmar's requirements and therefore, a total of 39 types of chemicals have been controlled. In 2022, 79 cases were arrested for a total value of 27602.681 million kyats and in 2021, 32 cases were arrested for a total value of 9888.486 million kyats. Therefore, 47 cases of seizure were increased more than 2021 and the total valued money increased 17714.195 million kyats seized.

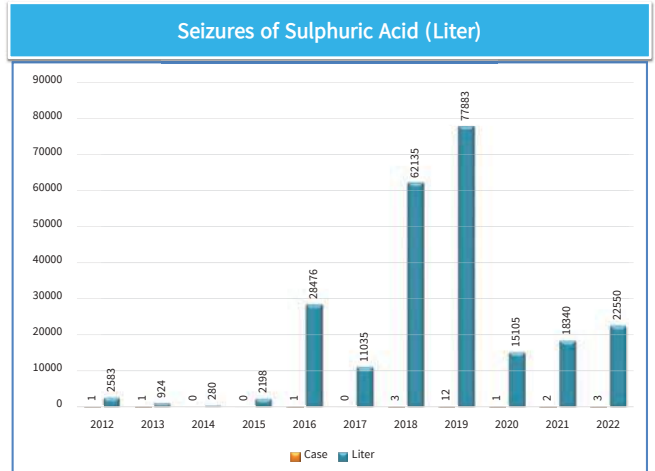
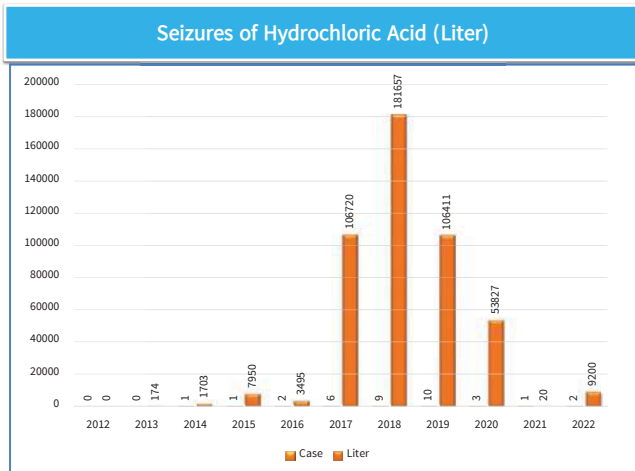
36. In 2022, the significant seizures cases of controlled and uncontrolled chemicals were 3600 kilos of Caffeine on 3-6-2022 and 1500 kg of Caffeine on 26-7-2022, on 28-12-2022, 1350 kilos of caffeine and 4 mixers machines, 1000 kilos of caffeine on 30-12-2022 in Tachilek Township, 1500 liters of Acetone, 750 liters of chloroform liquid, PHENOL LOOSE CRYSTALS white crystals 9000 kg, DI PROPYLENE GLYCOL DIBENZOATE LIQUID 650 liters in Tharsi Township, on 6-4-2022, 4600 liters of Sulfuric Acid in Pyin Oo Lwin Township, on 21-5-2022, 1875 kilos of Sodium Acetate in Lashio Township on 9-7-2022, on 11-7-2022, 2,500 kilos of Sodium Acetate were first seized in Theinni Township, and according to the investigation, another seizure was made in Muse Township, totaling 5,300 kilos of Sodium Acetate, Potassium Sulfate 2400 kilos, Sodium Carbonate 6750 kilos, Sodium Chloride 380 kilos, on 25-7-2022, 14,500 kilos of Theophylline Anhydrous powder were seized in Muse township, and according to the chained connection, 3,000 kilos of Ammonium Nitrate and 2,000 kilos of Copper Sulfate were seized in Pyigyí Takkhoon Township, 6090 liters of Toluene, on 23-8-2022 in Pathein Gyi Township, on 26-8-2022, Toluene 19600 liters, on 30-8-2022 in Sagaing City, 13 hundredthousand tablets of pseudoephedrine and 360 liters of Ethyl Ether, 13,650 liters of Sulfuric Acid, 5400 kilos of sodium ethoxide, 2160 liters of methanoide nitric acid in Mong Yel Township on 2-10-2022 and 4300 liters of Sulfuric Acid in Ywar Ngan Township on 26-10-2022.



### Trafficking routes of controlled chemicals

37. According to the seizure cases, the trafficking routes of controlled chemicals were identified as follow:

- (a) Trafficking route from Myawaddy on the Thai-Myanmar border
  - Myawaddy - Mawlamyaing - Moattama - Paung - Thahtong - Kyikhto-Phayagyi - Bago to Yangon- Mandalay via Yangon.
- (b) Trafficking route from Tachileik on the Thai-Myanmar border
  - (1) Mekong River route - from Tachileik - Kyaig Tong - Tarkaw – Loilin- via Hopone- Taunggyi, Shan State (South).
  - (2) Mekong River route – from Bushe junction- Yan Khaung in Tachileik Township.
  - (3) Thailand, Mae Sai Creek- Tachileik.
  - (4) Tachileik- Kyaing Tong- Kun Hein.
- (c) Trafficking route from China-Myanmar border.
  - (1) From near the China-Myanmar border Kyinsankyawt gate, Muse- Namphetkar-Kutkhaing-Theinni-Lashio-Mongyal.
  - (2) From the China-Myanmar border Kyinsankyawt gate, Muse-Lashio- Mandalay.
  - (3) China- Muse-Lashio-9-mile intersection-Namtlan-Kyaythee-Wanhaing.

### Seizure of Caffeine

38. In 2022, 9036.01 kg of Caffeine were seized in 5 cases and in 2021, 9335 kg of Caffeine were seized in 2 cases. Therefore, it was found that the seizures increased than 2021. But it was found that the seizures become decreasing.

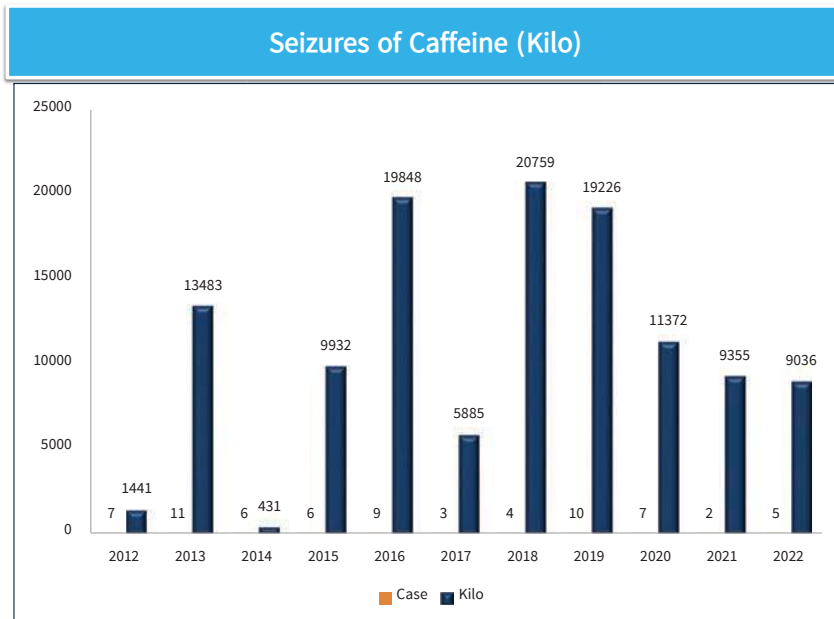
39. In 2022, as the seizures of Caffeine, there were 9036.01 kg in 5 cases in Shan State.

40. The significant cases of caffeine seizures in 20212 were 1000 kilos of caffeine on 12-3-2022; 3600 kilos of caffeine on 3-6-2022; 1500 kg of caffeine on 26-7-2022; on 28-12-2022, 1350 kilos of caffeine and 4 mixers; 1000 kilos of caffeine on 30-12-2022 in Tachilek Township.

### The trafficking routes of Caffeine

41. According to the seizures cases, it has been verified that caffeine is trafficked via the Vietnam-Laos-Mekong River routes in the following routes:

- (a) From the junction of Bushi Road in Mong Phyat Township to Yang Khong, Tachilek Township.



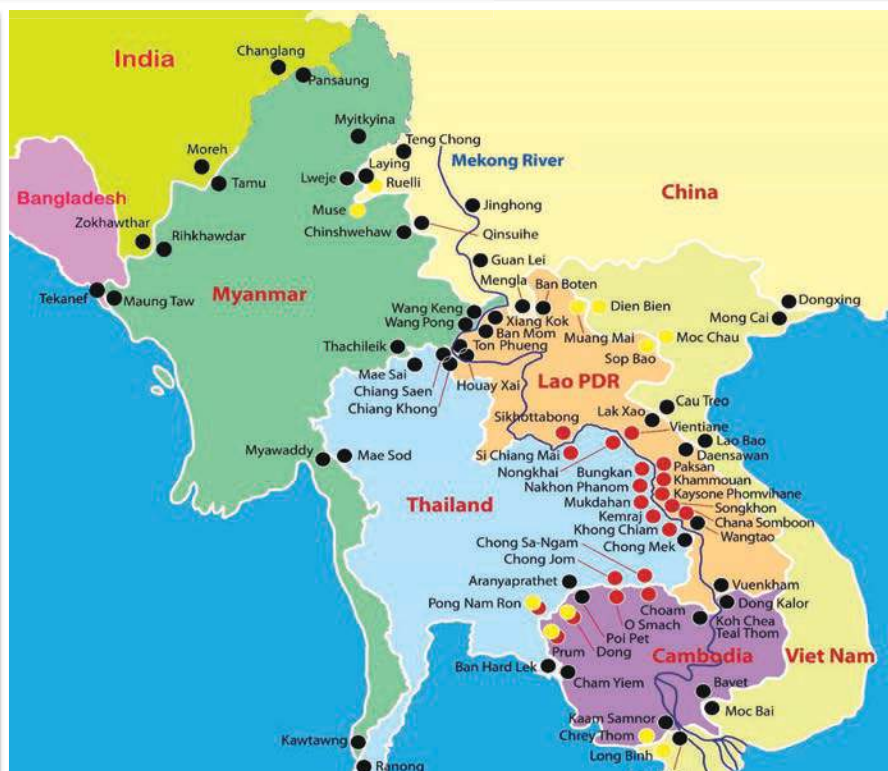
- (b) From the exit of Sai Khong Village , Mongsat Township- Mong Twun - Suspension Bridge – Yaypusan Hot Spring - Shwe Taung Shwe Ni - Saek Chan Kone - Hwe Ye City outside Road.
- (c) Tachilek Township; Wanlong Village Tract, from the new plot of Wan Lon Village to Kyaing Tong-Tarko-Kong Hein Township; Fanlang village group Phang Lang Village.
- (d) Taunggyi City via Tachileik to Kyaingtong-Tarko-Loylin- via Hopone- Taunggyi.

#### Activities on Drug Law Enforcement Works in Border Areas

42. In undertaking the drug law enforcement tasks, for conducting of information exchange in border areas in cooperation between the two bordering countries, a total of (13) Borders Liaison Offices: (4) BLOs in towns of Lwe Jel, Muse, Lauk Kai and Myitkyinar in the border area with China; (2) BLOs in Wam Pon and Wam Kyin in the border with Laos; (3) BLOs in Tachileik, Myawaddy and Kawthaung in the border area with Thailand; (3) BLOs in Pan Saung, Tamu and Reih Khau Dar in border areas with India, and (1) BLO in Maung Taw in the border area with Bangladesh were established to exchange information and cooperate between the border-sharing countries. As the exchange of information and cooperation were made by establishing the BLOs, the offenders who committed the different crimes and absconded into the border areas were handed over between the two countries. As a result, the exchange of offenders between countries has been carried out with neighboring countries, during 2001- 2021, (73) offenders in (29) times from Myanmar to China and from 2004 to 2013 (17)

offenders in (18) times from China to Myanmar were extradited. And also 25 offenders in 21 times to Thailand were handed over by Myanmar during 1997-2022 and 3 offenders in 3 times from Thailand to Myanmar during 2005- 2013. In 2005, Myanmar extradited (1) offender in (1) time to Italy and (1) offender in (1) time to Japan, and in 2018 Cambodia extradited (1) offender in (1) time to Myanmar.

### Drawing up and undertaking of public- cooperation and participation plan on the drug prevention and suppression

43. In order to implement effectively drug prevention and suppression works, the public-cooperating and participating plan of the drug prevention and suppression has been drawn up and implemented and the effective drug law enforcement work plan in Regions/States.

### Conducting of Special Operations on Drug Law Enforcement

44. The special operations on drug law enforcement have been conducting through the assessments over the production, transporting, selling and buying of narcotic drugs, and changes of drug trafficking routes. Thirty-eight special operations were conducted until

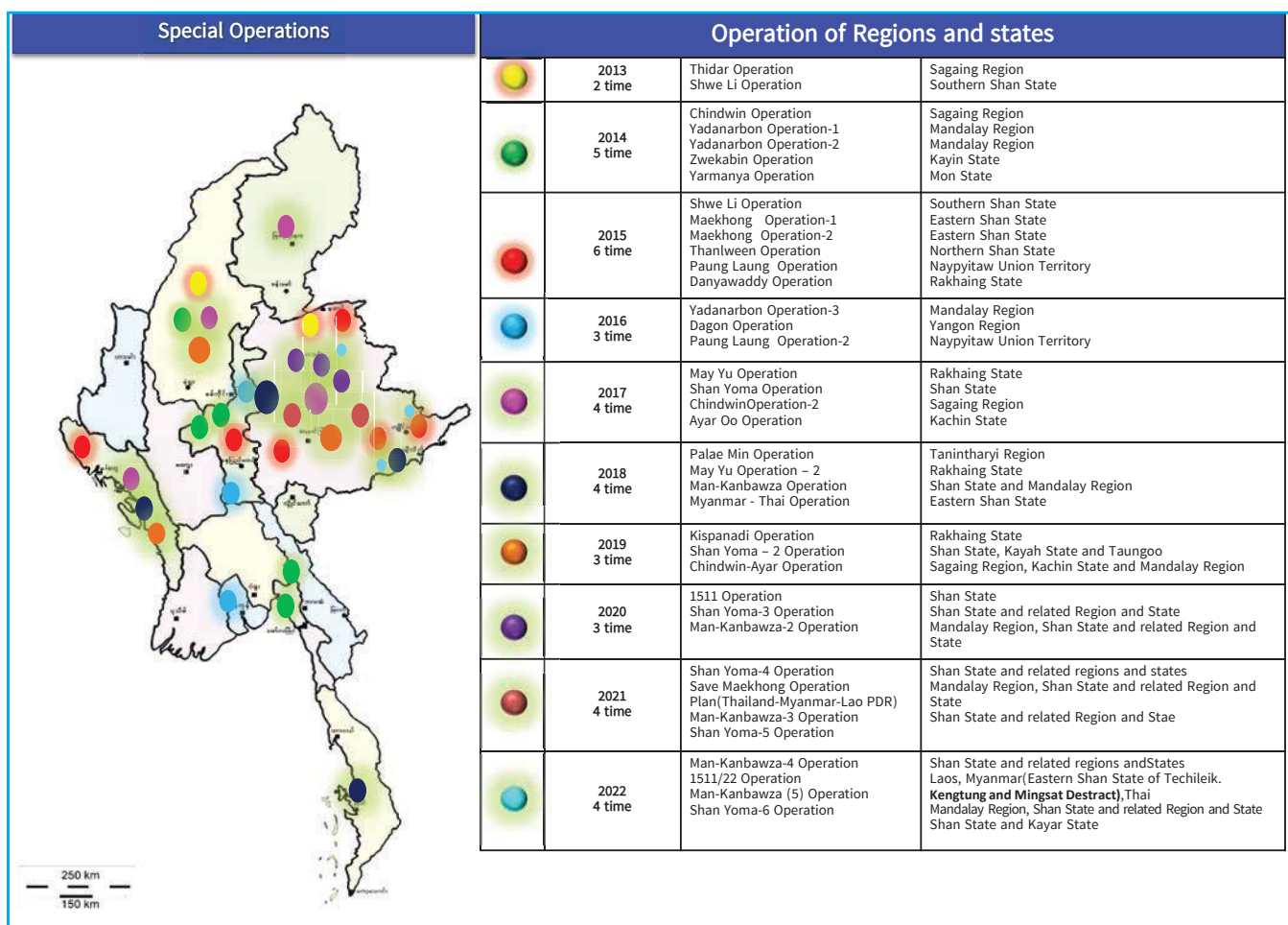


December 31, 2022 from 2013 and in 2022, the Special Operation 1511/22 including three countries ; Laos, Myanmar and Thailand and the Special Operation Man Kambawza (4) included the regions and states adjoined with the Shan State and Mandalay Region were carried out from January 15 to May 31, The Special Operation Man-Kambawza (5) from July 15 to September 30, and the Shan Yoma Operation (6) included the Shan State and its adjoining with the Kayah State from November 1 to December 31:

- (a) **Special Operation 1511/22 and the Special Operation Man Kambawza (4):** In the Special Operation 1511/22 cooperated simultaneously by each owned country among three countries; Laos-Myanmar- Thailand to prevent the illegal smuggling in of chemicals used in drug production into the Golden Triangle region and smuggling out of narcotic drugs from the region to the outside, there were included the Districts of Tachileik and Mong Hsat. As Myanmar, Shan Yoma Special -4 operation conducted adjoining the regions and states adjoined with the Shan State and Mandalay Region from January 15 to May 31, 2022 and there was a total of 865 cases and a total of 1253 offenders : 22 cases of opium; over 330.842 kg, 124 cases of heroin; over 411.699 kg, 618 cases of stimulant tablets; more than 74.48 million stimulant tablets, more than 7.846 tons in 19 cases of Ice; over 551 kgs of Ketamine in 10 cases, more than 110 kilos in 33 cases of marijuana, 6 cases of solidified opium oil; more than 133 kg, 1 case of caffeine; over 1 tons, 6883 Ecstasy tablets in 5 cases, Sodium Cyanide 2 cases; more than 14050 kilos, and more than a total value of 395.483 billion kyats for other drugs, chemicals used in drug production and related materials were seized.
- (b) **The Special Operation Man- Kambawza (5):** From July 15 to 30 September 30, 2022, The Special Operation Man- Kambawza (5) was carried out in Mandalay Region, Shan State, the adjoining Kayah State and Bago Region and as for the seizures of narcotic drugs , a total of 568 cases of drug captures. and 896 defendants with 14 cases of opiums; more than 291 kgs; 96 heroin- cases; more than 303.92 kilos, 357 cases of stimulant tablets seizures; more than 10.58 million of stimulant tablets; 16 cases of Ice ; more than 1427 kilograms, 20 cases of marijuana; more than 53 kg; 6 Ketamine cases; more than 326 kilograms, 8 Cases of Ecstasy seizures; 17380 Ecstasy tablets; Happy Water 11 cases; more than 8 kilos, Caffeine 2 cases; 1800 kgs, Theophylline 1 case ; 14500 kg, 5 cases of Toluene ; 25860 liters, 1 case of Ephedrine; 1 kg, 1

case of crashed stimulant tablets; 2 kg, 1 case of Acetic Acid (Sodium Salt); 20,000 kg, and including other drugs and related accessories used in the drug production and a total value was 87.68 billion Kyats.

- (c) **Shan Yoma-6 Special operation:** Shan Yoma-6 operation in Shan State and adjoining Kayah State, Loikaw from November 1 to December 31, 2022 were carried out, and as the drug seizures, there were a total of 284 cases and 383 offenders : 13 cases of opium; more than 111 kgs, 41 cases of heroin; over 74 kg, 60 kgs of of brown opium powder in 1 case, over 16 kgs of solidified opium oil in 1 case, 179 cases of Stimulant tablets; over 9.44 million stimulant tablets, more than 257 kgs of crashed stimulant tablets, 6 cases of Ice; more than 143 kilos,, 8 cases of marijuana; more than 74 kg, more than 284 of Ketamine in 5 cases, over 6.23 hundred thousand tablets of Ecstasy in 4 cases, more than 142 kilos of Happy Water in 11 cases, Caffeine 1 case ;1383 kilos, Toluene 1case; 3450 liters, Ethly Acetate 3120 liters; Coloroform 1case; 4800



liters, Erimin-5, 35,000 tablets, 1 case of Sodium Acetate; 5250 kg, including other drugs and related accessories used in production of drugs and a total value of more than 92.98 billion kyats was seized.

### Educative Talks on Dangers of Narcotic Drugs

45. In 2022, in the whole country, Myanmar, 1217 times of Educative Talks on Dangers of Narcotic Drugs were conducted for 36010 attendees in each Regions/ States.

### Deployment of modernized materials and equipments for detection of drugs

46. The US-made LEIDOS VACIS M6500 Type Mobile X-Ray Checkpoint (Pyin Oo Lwin) (value of 6443 million kyats) was based at the X-Ray Machine Ant-Narcotic Unit near Pyin Oo Lwin and has been inspecting passing vehicles on the Mandalay-Muse Union Highway since 8<sup>th</sup> May 2019 and on 28-6-2022, it was moved and opened near Myo Gyi village in Ywar Ngan Township and has been inspecting passing vehicles on the Taunggyi-Mandalay Union Highway.

47. It was a type of Agilent Resolve MXVSS Mobile X-Ray Checkpoint (Kywee Tet Hsone) made in Russia and worth of 6453 million kyats in total. It was based at the X-Ray Machine Anti-Narcotic Unit (Kwyee Tet Hsone) near Kywee Tet Hsone in Tharsi Township and starting

The American made VACIS IP 6500 type X-Ray device worth of 6468.25 millions kyats was based at the X-Ray Machine Anti-Narcotic Unit (Wetwun) was opened near Wetwun village in Pyin Oo Lwin Township on 4-2-2022 and it has been inspecting the vehicles passed on the Mandalay-Muse Union Highway Road.

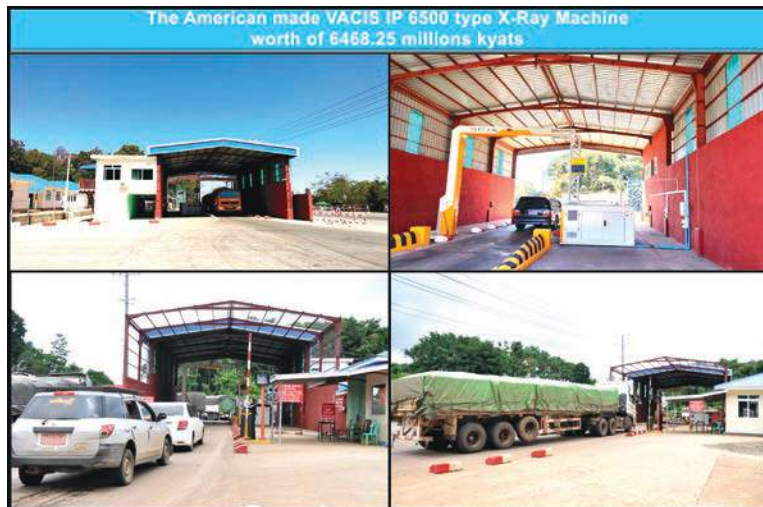
49. The Russia made Linear Electron Accelerator (LINACS) Machine worth of 6420 million kyats was based at the X-Ray device Anti-Narcotic Unit (Nyaung Khar Shay) was opened Nyaung Khar Shay village in Waw Township on 25-8-2022 and it has been inspecting the vehicles passed on the Yangon-Mawlamyaing Highway Road.

50. (7) Sets of Rigaku Chemical Scanners were deployed by the Drug Enforcement Division to the anti-narcotic units in the towns of Mandalay, Muse, Lashio, Taungyi, Loi Lin, Tachileik and Yangon and Myawaddy which are pivotal along the drug trafficking routes and these units have been conducting with higher impetus the drug law enforcement works.

51. (14) Hand-held X-Ray devices were bought with State Budget and they were deployed at the anti-narcotic units

in the cities of Nay Pyi Taw, Magwe, Mandalay, Muse, Lashio, Taunggyi, Pin Laung, Loi Lin,





Kyaing Tong, Tachileik, Pyay, Mawlamynie and Yangon where are the main twons on the drug trafficking routes, have been using with uplifting impetus in the drug law enforcement works.

### **Destruction of seized narcotic drugs and chemicals**

52. On the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, which fell on 26 June, 2022, the plans of destruction and burning of seized narcotic drugs and precursor chemicals in one year period was conducted in accordance with the instructions of the Ministry of Health and Sports relating to the COVID-19 in the cities of Yangon, Mandalay and Taunggyi. 33 types of narcotic drugs and three types of precursor chemicals worth 356.688 billion kyat (over US \$ 192.804 million) at Yangon West Highway Trucks Terminal compound, Hlaing Tharyar Township in Yangoon on June 26, twenty-five types of narcotic drugs and precursor chemicals worth 316.778 billion kyats (over US \$ 171.231 million) at Chanmya Tharsi Old Airport Ground in Chanmya Tharsi Township Thar San Township , Mandalay City on June 26, 58 types of narcotic drugs and precursor chemicals worth 515.36 billion kyats ( over 278.573 million U.S dollars) at Awayyar balloon ground in Taunggyi City. The Ceremony on the Destruction of Narcotic Drugs, Chemicals and Related Materials in Mandalay City was attended by the Union Minister for the Ministry of Home Affairs and Chairman of the Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control Lieutenant General Soe Htut.

53. The seized narcotic drugs, precursor chemicals and related materials used in drug production, on June 26,2022 were burnt and destroyed and over 2.6 tons of opium, over 1.9 tons of heroin, over 212 million of stimulant tablets, more than 23.6 tons of Ice, more than 709 kilograms of marijuana, over 1.2 tons of Mitragyna Speciosa powder and including more than 2 tons of Ketamine and over 12 tons of Caffeine, a total of 79 types of drugs and chemicals which were worth of 1188.82 billion kyats (over US \$ 642.608 million) were destroyed.



## Significant Seizures of Narcotic Drugs in 2022

### Seizure of 180 kilos of opium

54. On 5-3-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (21) Kumlon asked to stop the YGN 5H-6818 Tiger 4 Wheel vehicle for inspection at milepost number (43) on the Kumlong-Lashio highway in Kunlon Township driving from Holi village towards Hseni Town. When the anti-narcotic unit asked to stop for inspection, the driver drove away and was chased and run away from the vehicle at milepost No.(42), and seized 180 kgs of opium from the back of the vehicle. It was taken into action at the Kunlon Township Police Station with F.I.R (Narcotics) No. 6/2022 under the Section 19(a) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.



### Seizure of 63 kilos of opium

55. On 11-6-2022, while the X-Ray Device Unit (Kwyaetatsone) Township was inspecting with X-Ray Device the MDY 9P-3417 Hijet vehicle which was driven by Tin Soe (male) accompanied by d Soe Htet (male) from Kalaw to Tharsi at the Mobile X-Ray (Kwyaetatsone), suspicious images were found, and searched and seized 63 kilos of opium from inside the fuel tank false-compartment and inside the iron container attached to the frame under the floor. . It was taken into action against Tin Soe and Soe Htet (males) at the Tharsi Township Police Station with F.I.R (Narcotics) No. 9/2022 under the Section 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.



### Seizures of 125 kilos of opium and 16.72 kilos of heroin

56. On 9-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (3) Mohnyin seized 16.72 kilos of heroin, 125 kilos of opium and 1 mobile phone of the BGO 6E-9385 FUSO 12-wheeled vehicle driven by Sai Thura Kyaw @ Pho Thae @ Pho Thein (male) from Mandalay City to Hopin Town at the Nan Siaung Joint Checkpoint in Mohnyin Township. In connection with seizure case, Zaw Zaw Soe @ Pho Lone (male) was arrested and under interrogation, it was found out that Than Win @ Than Soe Oo was asked him to carry. It was taken into action against Sai Thura Kyaw @ Pho Thae @ Pho Thein (male), Zaw Zaw Soe @ Pho Lone



(male) and Than Win @ Than Soe Oo at the Moe Hnyin Township Police Station with F.I.R (Narcotics) No. 50/2022 under the Section 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

### Seizure of 176.4 kilos of opium

57. On 2-8-2022, at the X-Ray Checkpoint (Kywaetatsone), 176.4 kilos of opium hidden inside the false compartment in the body wall and 4 mobile phones were seized from the MON-4/3B-2696 MITSUBISHI FUSO FT418V 12-wheeled vehicle driven by Pyae Phyo Tun (male), Myo Kyaw Thu (male) and Thant Zin Ko (male) from Kalaw to Thar Si. It was revealed that Hla Win (male) asked to carry the drug. It was taken into action against Pyae Phyo Tun (male), Myo Kyaw Thu (male) and Thant Zin Ko (mal) and Hla Win (male) altogether four persons at the Thar Si Township Police Station with F.I.R (Narcotics) No. 14/2022 under the Section 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.



### Seizure of 78 kilos of opium

58. ### Seizures of 30.8 kilos of heroin and 2,2800 stimulant tablets

It was taken into action against U Indrasara @ Sai Aung Than (not yet arrested) , U Yarzainda @ Sia Lut and U Wilartha @Sai Hsar Lu (males) with FIR (Narcotic) No. 8/2022 at the Naung Cho Township Police Station under the Section 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.



### Seizure of 1.5 million stimulant tablets

85. On 29-1-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (1) Mandalay seized 7 hundred thousand stimulant tablets in the polythene bags from inside the front part of the MDY 3D9-251 FUSO and seized 8 hundred thousand stimulant tablets in the polythene bags from inside the front part of the SHN 3L/4693 FUSO vehicle while searching and found the suspicious images a 12-wheel vehicle driven by Wai Phyo Kyaw (male) accompanied by San Win (male) and a 6-wheel vehicle driven by Wunna Kyaw (male) at the Mobile X-Ray (Kyawe Tat Sone) checkpoint in Tharsi Township from Taunggyi to Tharsi Township, a total of 15 hundred thousand stimulant tablets. It was taken into action against Wai Phyo Kyaw @ Ah Ngae Lay (male), San Win (male) and Wunna Kyaw @ Dway Ngae (male) with FIR (Narcotic) No. 2/2022 at the Namasa (Amarapura) Police Station under the Section 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

On 20-6-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (62) Thatong seized 1700 kilos Ice (methamphetamine), 300 kilos of Ketamine and 41 rods of molds and 19 cups from the false-compartment of the oil storage tank of the BGO 4C-5969 12-wheeled oil tanker that was driven by Myo Chit Ko Ko (male) accompanied by Mai Than (male) at Ma Mayan Chaung Joint Inspection Station in



Kyaikhto Township. It was revealed that Sai Min Thu and San Min Naing, who were in charge of carrying the drugs and acting as vanguards, left the front. It was taken into action against Myo Chit Ko Ko (male), Mai Than @ Sapalain (male), Sai Min Thu and San Min Naing @ Sa Mote (male) (not arrested) with FIR (Narcotics) No. 27/2022 at the Mamasa (Thaton) Police Station under the Section 16 (b)/19(a)/21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

### **Seizure of 1096 kilos of Ice (methamphetamine)**

108. On 19-10-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (64) Konhein seized 1096 kilos of Ice (methamphetamine) on a SHN 4Q-4263 UD TRUCKS 12-wheeled vehicle driven by Sai Phyo Wai Thant @ Aik Lyan (male) accompanied by Sai Aik Moon @ Aik Moon (male) from Kali City to Mong Pyin City at Tarkor Bridge Joint Checkpoint in Konhein Township. It was revealed that Sai Aung Htay Win @ Aung Htay from Karli town asked to carry it.



It was taken into action against Sai Phyo Wai Thant @ Aik Lyan (male), Sai Aik Moon @ Aik Moon (male) and Sai Aung Htay Win @ Aung Htay (male) (not arrested) with FIR (Narcotics) No. 16/2022 at the Namasa (Karli) Police Station under the Section 19(a)/21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

### **Seizure of 2000 kilos of Ice (Methamphetamine)**

109. On 22-11-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (32) Myawaddy seized 2,000 kg of Ice from the MDY 7L-6756 LIFAN blue 6-wheeled vehicle driven by Sai Maung @ Sai Moo (male) accompanied by Htoo Htet @ Aik Lu (male) and Khin Soe @ Saw Ah Kyo (male) driving from Thamanya village



towards Myawaddy town at the Tadar Kyo Joint Checkpoint in Kawkareik Township. It was uncovered that Kolay @ Maung Kyaw @ San Nyein asked to carry it. It was taken into action against Sai Maung @ Sai Moo (male), Htoo Htet @ Aik Lu (male) and Khin Soe @ Saw Ah Kyo (male) and Kolay @ Maung Kyaw @ San Nyein (male) (not arrested) with FIR (Narcotics) No. 14/2022 at the Mamasa (Kawkareik) Police Station under the Section 19(a)/21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.



**Seizure of 1500 kilos of Ice (methamphetamine)**

110. On 26-11-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (62) Thaton, acting on a tip-off, waited at Dai Oo Road intersection in Waw Township at 1210 p.m, MDY-1 6C-2436 FOTON 22-wheel trailer driven by Aye Min Nai (male) was inspected by the X-Ray Machine Unit (Nyaung Khar Shay) and a suspicious image was found and searched the car. 1,500 kilos of Ice were in the front compartment of the trailer. On 28-11-2022, at the place over



the city of Mine Naung, Aung Soe @ Nay Lin Htike, Saw William and Sai Pan Sein, the case-connected accused were arrested in the Mong Naung-Wan Hai road and Min Ko Naing, Tun Naing Oo, Kyaw Win @ Ah Shay Gyi and Sai Khay Lee are avoiding. It was taken into action against all of them with the FIR (Narcotics) No. 45/2022 at the Mamasa (Thaton) Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/20 (a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

**The interception of Ice that will be transported to Malaysia water territory**

**Seizures of 997 kilos of Ice and 798 kilos of Ketamine**

111. On 11-3-2022, Anti- Narcotic Unit (62) Thaton seized 997 kilos of Ice and 798 kilos of Ketamine from inside the front false compartment of the YGN 4N-6809 ISUZU 6-wheeled container truck, which was driven by Bo Bo (male) from Bago to Mawlamyaing at the Mayan Chaung Joint Inspection Station Yangon - Mawlamyaing road in Kyaikhto Township. It was taken into action against Bo Bo (male), Ye Thu Aung (male) and Myo Thu aung (male) (not arrested) with the



FIR (Narcotics) No. 15/2022 at the Mamasa (Thaton) Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

**Seizure of 251 kilos of Ice (meth amphetamine)**

112. On 3-5-2022, Anti- Narcotic Unit (16) Pyin Oo Lwin, seized 251 kilos of Ice valued at 6.275 billion kyats from a WISH vehicle MDY RLG-4511 driven by Win Hlaing @ U Chel @ U Khe (male) and U Waryama @ U Hla Baw (male) on the road between Ping Lain Village and Pwe Kauk Village from Kyauk Mae to Mandalay, X-Ray Machine Unit (Wetwun) Bypass Road. In connection with the case, the defendants, Sai Naw Kham (male) and Sai Shenfa (male), and Ahr Ji (male) and Tun



Naing (male) on 4-5-2022 Win Myint (male) and Aung Myat Win @ Ko Pauk @ Phon Sai Al (male) and on 7-5-2022, Shine Htet Aung @ Rakhine @ San Shay (male), Aye Thaung (male), Myo Naing (male) and Than Soe (male) altogether 4 persons , on 8-5-2022, Nyan Win (male) was also arrested. It was taken into action against all of them with the FIR (Narcotics) No. 12/2022 at the Mamasa (North Oakalar) Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/ 20 (b)/21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

**Seizure of 1000 kilos of Ice**

113. On 25-6-2022, while the Tatmadaw (Navy) found a suspicious fishing boat during patrolling and asked to stop it with showing signal light, it fled away. But 1,000 kgs of Ice was seized from the fishing boat without persons between 19 D, 37.5 minutes and east longitude 93 D, 18.5 minutes and far about 9 miles southwest of Kyun Thar Yar Island. The body of the boat was found to have the name "Dana Pwar Aung" engraved on it, and the Anti- Narcotic Unit (47) Sittwe investigated and it is known that it is owned by Sein Kyaw



Maung (male) from Thae Khon Village, Pauk Taw Township and is being operated by his son Zaw Zaw @ Zaw Win Tun. It was taken into action against Sein Kyaw Maung (male) and

Zaw Zaw @ Zaw Win Tun (male) (not arrested) with the FIR (Narcotics) No. 3/2022 at the Mamasa (Kyauk Phyu) Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

### Seizure of 1000 kilos of Ice

114. On 28-6-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (25) Taunggyi searched the BGO 2Q-5354 FUSO 6-wheeled vehicle driven by Myo Tun (male) accompanied by Zar Ni Htwe from Ywar Ngan to Han Myint Moh at the Covid-19 checkpoint at the exit from Ywar Ngan Town on Ywar Ngan – Han Myint Moh Road and interrogated them and found in suspicious condition. It was uncovered that on 26-6-2022, two of them gave the YGN 5H-4111 PASSO vehicle driven from Yangon to



Kho Lam to Win Ko Ko (male), it was received information that the vehicles YGN 5H-4111 PASSO and YGN 1A-7477 Hino with "Thet Zaw Htwe" signboard may contain drugs, and at 1600 hours on 27-6-2022, it was found that the 2 vehicles had arrived in Namsan City and the arrest was made. On 28-6-2022, the Anti-Narcotic Unit (27) from Loilin arrested 10 suspects including Win Ko Ko (male) with the YGN 5H-4111 PASSO VEHICLE and YGN 1A-7477 Hino vehicle near Ho Tint Village and seized 1,000 kilos of Ice were seized from iron boxes loaded with shop goods, and Ko Sai @ Tun Tun Aye (male), who was forced to carry drugs, was arrested again. It was taken into action against Ko Sai @ Tun Tun Aye (male), Win Ko Ko (male), Than Kyaw Kyaw (male), Ye Nai Tun @ Ko Ye (Male), Zaw Min Naung @ Ah Gyi Kaung (male), Thura @ Ah Gyi Kaung (male), Than Thut Oo @ Ah Shay Gyi, Zane Htwe @ Zar Ni (male), Myo Htun (male), Ye Moe Aung @ Dollar Moe (male), Khin Maung Tun (b) Tun Tun (male), Aye Hlaing (male) and Zaw Maung (male) with the FIR (Narcotics) No. 44/2022 at the Taunggyi Township Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/20(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

### Seizure of 1500 kilos of Ice and 1 kilo of Ketamine

115. On 8-10-2022, Anti - Narcotic Unit (16) Pyin Oo Lwin searched the MDY 1P-4404 DONGFENG (6) wheeled vehicle driven by Ngwe Aung (male) accompanied by Min Min (male), suspiciously, from Mogok to Pyin Oo Lwin Road in Pyin Oo Lwin Township, passed through X-Ray machine and seized 1500 kilos of Ice and Ketamine 1 Kilo contained in black bags



labeled Coffee Espresso. It was uncovered that Nay Lin Aung asked to carry the drugs. It was taken into action against Ngwe Aung, Min Min and Nay Lin Aung (males) with the FIR (Narcotics) No. 35/2022 at the Namasa (Peik Chin Myaung) Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/ 21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.

### Seizure of 1000 kilos of Ice

116. On 9-11-2022, while Anti-Narcotic Unit (35) Myeik was going to search the suspicious MDY 5P-4505 FUSO near Lelkel Village, Thamote Village-Tract in Myeik Township, Oh Ngae @ Khin Kyaw Naing was arrested, and seized 1000 kilos of Ice contained in the polythene bags from the vehicle and surrounding areas. The 3 people; Sha Ywal @ Ahlar (male) and Bawm Htan @ Baw Saung (male) and Bawm Zawm (mlae) were arrested at the No. (1) Ball Bridge, Myeik City, and Zaw Twel (male) and Lwam Hu (male) on the Aye Yeik Chaung Road in Kan Phyar Ward in Myeik Town and on 12-11-2022, Thant Zin and his wife, Aye Myat Sanda Tun, were arrested at the Ma Lwae Taung Joint Checkpoint and Saw Aung (FUSO 6-wheel driver) and Thiha (vehicle follower), in front area of the house In Dhana Aung Guest House and Thant Zin Oo in Khalokkhalu village, Twan Tay Township, and Myint Zaw Oo at (88) Ward, Paduma Road, Dagon Seikkan Township and Zaw Gyi was also arrested at his residence at No. (720) in Lashio at 1305 hours, 15-11-2022. Yaw Bon, Khunshu @ Watoke @ Soetha, Khaung Naw @ La Shi Naw (b) Ahnaw, Lard Si, Kaung Chint @ Ahgu @ Watoke were avoiding. It was taken into action against them with the FIR (Narcotics) No. 9/2022 at the Namasa (Thamote) Police Station under the Section No. 19(a)/ 20(a)(b)/ 22(a)/21 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.





### A seizure of 50 kg of cannabis

117. On 7-5-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (26) Pinlaung arrested Khun Sein Mg (aka) Tee Poke (Male) near the entrance of TaungLay Village, Lain Nyar Village Group of Pinlaung Township, and 1 kg of cannabis was found from his vehicle. Subsequently, the officers escorted him to his residential unit, where about 49 kg of cannabis were uncovered from the unit. The defendant, Khun Sein Mg is being taken action for drug-related offense under Section 19(a) of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-3/2022 at Pinlaung Police Station.



### A seizure of 20.7 kg of cannabis

118. On 7-6-2022, the officers from Botahtaung Police Station raided the room number (0803), at the 8 floor, Building C-2 (A), on the Merchant Road of Botahtaung Township. From within the search of the residential unit, where the Sixth suspects, namely Myat Min Htike (Male), Kyaw Min Thein (Male), Htet Ko Oo (Male), Zaw Zaw (Male), Htet Naing Min (Male), and Htin Aung Lin, were arrested. About 20.7 kg of cannabis along with cash amounting to 350,000 kyats were uncovered from them. The defendants is facing the charge of contrary to section 19(a), 20 (a) and 21 with FIR No-5/2022 at Botahtaung Police station.



### A seizure of multiple controlled drugs including 37.32 kg of cannabis, 2839 tablets of ecstasy, and 0.255 kg of Ketamine

119. On 15-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (43) Yangon (South) arrested Min Thurein (aka) Baygyi in the vicinity of Sanchaung Street, Sanchaung Township, and 100 Ecstasy tablets and 0.005 kg of Ketamine were recovered from him. The man was also followed to his residence in the same vicinity, where about 2739 Ecstasy tablets, 0.25 kg of Ketamine, and 37.32 kg of cannabis were seized. Initial investigation revealed that Min Thurein delivered the drugs to Than Toe Oo @ Than Gyee who ordered on Facebook. The defendants, Min Thurein (Male) and Than Toe Oo @ Than Gyee (at large) had been taken action for drug-related offense under Section 19(a)/21 of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-10/2022 at Sanchaung Police Station.



### A seizure of 62 kg of cannabis

120. On 29-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (15) Magway arrested Wai Lu Kyaw (Male) and Aye Aye Mon (Female) after intercepting their motor vehicles near the Khunzu conjunction, Minbuu-Amm old road, Nga Phe Township of Magway Division. A total of about 62 kg of cannabis, along with cash amounting to 0.1845 million MMK and 2 mobile phones were seized and recovered from them. Subsequently, the officers arrested Khant Lwin Mg (Male) who is the intended recipient of the cannabis, near the same vicinity. All drug related suspects had been charged with conspiracy to traffic the commercial quantities of controlled drugs, illegal possession and sales of drugs, contrary to Section 19(a), 20 (a), 21 of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-8/2022 at Padan Police Station.



### A seizure of 13 kg of cannabis

121. On 13-9-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (55) Meiktila arrested Ye Lin Tun (Male) after intercepting his motor vehicle in the vicinity of Kywetatsone village, Tharzi Township. About 13 kg of cannabis and one mobile phone were seized and the related suspects had been charged illegal possession and sales of controlled drugs contrary to Section 19(a), 21 of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-18/2022 at Tharzi Police Station.



### A seizure of 28.45 kg of cannabis

122. On 10-10-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (42) Yangon (East) arrested Hla Tun Lwin (Male) after intercepting his motor vehicle near the bus-stop, in the vicinity of Min Ye Kyaw Swar Road, 118 ward, Eastern Yangon. A total of about 1.48 kg of a cannabis block and one mobile phone were recovered from the vehicle. The man was escorted to his residence in the vicinity of (134) ward, Eastern Yangon where about 17 blocks of cannabis weighing about 24.65 kg were seized. According to the interrogation toward the seized drugs were brought from Aye Maw Lwin (Female) to conduct drug dealings. The suspects from this case had been charged with drug related activities contrary to the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law.



### A seizure of 64.05 kg of cannabis

123. On 13-10-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (22) Muse raided the residence of Sai Myint Naing @ Sai Tun Hla (Male) at Hona Place, Muse Township. From within the unit, officers found 107 cannabis plants that were being cultivated in his farm and about 64.05 kg of cannabis were seized from his warehouse. The defendants were facing charges of illegal cultivation, possession and sales of controlled drugs.



### A seizure of 140 kg of Kratom Leaves

124. On 5-3-2022, officers from the Local Police Station arrested Hla Htoo (Male) and accompanied by Kyaw Myo Aung (Male) after intercepting their vehicle in the vicinity of Kyunywar - Kyaikmaraw road of Kyaikmaraw Township. From within a search, officers seized 140 kg of Kratom leaves from the vehicle and he admitted that they were hired by Tar Kay (Male) to transport it to the Atun (Male), an unidentified person. The suspects related to the drug activities are being taken action for drug-related offences under Section 19(a)/21 of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-10/2022 at Kyaikmaraw Police Station.



### A seizure of 16 kg of Kratom Powder

125. On 20-4-2022, officers from Tanintharyi Police Station arrested Myo Lin (Male) after intercepting his motor vehicle in the vicinity of Zaywe Village group, Tanintharyi Township and a bag containing about 16 kg of Kratom powder was recovered from his vehicle. Subsequently, he was facing charges of illegal transporting of drugs under Section 19(a) of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-8/2022 at Tanintharyi Police Station.



### A seizure of 42 kg of Kratom leaves

126. On 11-6-2022, officers from Local Police Station raided the residential unit of Kyaw Mon Thu in the vicinity of Phekatar village, Pha-An Township and a total of about 42 kg of Kratom Leaves were recovered from his unit. Subsequently, he was facing charges of illegal possession of drugs under Section





19(a) of the Narcotic Drug and Psychoactive substances Law with FIR No-16/2022 at Zat Tha Pyin Police Station.

**A seizure of 85 kg of Kratom Powder and 0.05 kg of cannabis**

127. On 16-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (35) Myeik raided the residential of Theingi Tun in the vicinity of Ka Lwin village group of Myeik Township and a total of about 85 kg of Kratom Powder and 0.05 kg of cannabis were recovered from her unit. The offender was facing the charges of illegal possession of drugs contrary to Section 19(a) of Narcotic Drugs and Psychoactive Substances Law with FIR No- 132/2022 at the Myeik Police Station.



**A seizure of 85 kg of Kratom Powder and 0.05 kg of cannabis**

128. On 2-8-2022, officers from Local Police Station arrested Daw Nya (Female), accompanied by Ma Sein (Female) after intercepting their Honda Fit vehicle at the Panga Checkpoint, in Thanbyuzayat Township and 5200 stimulant tablets under compartment of back seat were recovered from the vehicle. After that, the officers searched Daw Nya's residential unit and also recovered 20.4125 kg of Kratom leaves and 3 kg of ICE from the TOYOTA SUCCEED parked beside her unit. The arrests are facing charges of illegal possession of controlled drugs under Narcotic Drugs and Psychoactive Substances Law.



**A seizure of 22.95 kg of Kratom Powder, a Gun and Ammunition**

129. On 24-9-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (34) Kawthoung raided a Camp located in the village of Kawthaung Township, and arrested Soe Tin @ Soepay for the suspected drug offence. During the search operation, 22.095 kg of Kratom Powder, a gun and ammunition were recovered within his unit and he was facing the charges of illegal drug activities under Narcotic Drugs and Psychoactive Substances Law.





### The seizure of 12875 kg of Ammonium Nitrate

130. On 4-3-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (36) Bago conducted a search towards MDY 2B-5371 NISSAN DIESEL TRUCK driven by Aung Myint Myat, between Mile stone 190/5 and mile stone 190/6 on the former Yangon-Mandalay road in Yedashe Township and seized 12875 kg of Ammonium Nitrate from the vehicle. The offenders Aung Myint Myat and Aung Thu (absconder) have been taken under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substance law.



### The seizure of 1000 kg of Caffeine

131. On 12-3-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (30) Tachileik conducted a search towards SHN 3R-1131 Hilux vehicle heading to Tachileik from Bu-shi and the persons who were on the vehicle fled away. The officers could arrest one named Tun Shwe (male) along with 1000 kg of Caffeine. In this case, Tun Shwe and Pi Eike (not arrested) have been taken under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law.



### The seizure of 1500 liters of Acetone, 750 liters of Chloroform, 9000 kg of PHENOL LOOSE CRYSTALS and 650 liters of DI PROPYLNR GLYCOL DIBEZOATE

132. On 6-4-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (55) Meiktila searched SHN 4J-2549 vehicle driven by SAI NAY AUNG TUN with KHUN NUT SAI, at mobile X-Ray check point (Kywetatson) in Thazi and arrested them along with 1500 liters of Acetone, 750 liters of Chloroform, 9000 kg of PHENOL LOOSE CRYSTALS and 650 liters of DI PROPYLENE GLYCOL DIBENZOATE on the vehicle. In the case, offenders; SAI NAY AUNG TUN , KHUN NUT SAI and Lu Sein (not arrested) have been taken action under Narcotic and Psychotropic Substances Law.



### The seizure of 4600 liters of Sulphuric Acid

133. On 21-5-2022, a combined team Anti-Narcotic Unit (17) Mandalay (North) and Anti-Narcotic Unit (16) Pyin Oo Lwin conducted a search towards MDY 1Q-4638 NISSAN vehicle driven by Kyaw Zaya accompanied with Myat Noe and Ngwe Phyo Thin, near Pyinzar Regional Police Station and seized



4600 liters of Sulphuric Acid putting in 230 plastic buckets. In this case, all offenders Kyaw Zaya, Myat Noe @ Paing Gyi and Wai Phyo Thin @ Naung Naung @ Hmwe Ni have been charged with Narcotic drugs and Psychotropic Substances laws in Pynzar Regional Police Station.

### The seizure of 8600 kg of Sodium Ethoxide

134. On 26-5-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit 22) Muse searched MGY 5I-2862 HYUNDAI STAREX express bus driven by Tun Win, heading to Muse Township from Mong Yu village near 105 mile, near Nam Khum village and seized 1000 kg of Sodium Ethoxide on the vehicle. Kyaw Moe @ Chit Min who was an organizer in drug carrying was arrested on the vehicle. On 27-5-2022, Tun Tun Win @ Tun Tun was arrested along with SHN 2K-7776 TOYOTA CROWN and MITSUBISHI CANTER vehicle with 480 kg of SODIUM ETHOXIDE in the back part of the vehicle. According to the interrogation towards Tun Win and Kyaw Moe @ Chit Min, Maung Nyein @ Nyein Myint Oo who asked to carry Sodium Ethoxide and Tom Cho Chan who was an owner of Sodium Ethoxide were arrested. On 28-5-2022, No.24 Anti-Narcotic Taskforce conducted a search towards a warehouse of Myanmar Shin Kwum (Oxygen factory) in Khay Nin village, Lashio Township and arrested Kyaw Myo Htet and Lae Sandar (female) along with 6180 kg of Sodium Ethoxide and a CANTER vehicle. Furthermore, SAI EIK Khay who carried Sodium Ethoxide was arrested. According to the interrogation towards Tun Tun Win @ Tun Tun, 940 kg of Sodium Ethoxide was seized from his warehouse in Byone Taung bus station, near Kyin San Kyawt village in Muse Township. In relation to the seizure of 1000 kg of Sodium Ethoxide in Muse Township, Tun Win, Kyaw Moe @ Chit min, Tun Tun Win @ Tun Tun, Maung Nyein @ Nyein Myint Oo, Fatti (not arrested yet) have been charged with under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances law in Muse township. In relation to the seizure of 1420 kg of Sodium Ethoxide, Tun Tun Win @ Tun Tun, Aung Nyi Lwin @ Nyi Nyi, Kyaw Min Tun, Tom Cho Chan, Fatti (not arrested) have been taken action under the law in Lashio Township. In relation to the seizure of 6180 kg of Sodium Ethoxide, Lae Sandar @ Ar Shine, Kyaw Myo Htet, Sai Eik Khay, Aar Myint (not arrested) have been taken action under the law in Naung Mon Regional Police Station.





### The seizure of 3600 kg of Caffeine

135. On 3-6-2022, a combined team including Military and Myanmar Police Force conducted a search towards MDY 2R-5200 DUMP TRUCK driven by Lin Lin Aung, leading to Tachileik from Mong Sat Township, bypass of Huye Township at Lawetaw kham group in Tachileik Township and seized 3600 kg of Caffeine from the vehicle. The offenders have been charged under the law in Tachileik Police Station.



### The seizure of 1875 kg of Sodium Acetate

136. On 9-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (24) Lashio conducted a search near a factory at Charsho village in Lashio Township and Shan Takon car gate in no.3 Quarter in Lashio Township. During the search, the offices seized a Probox vehicle, a WISH vehicle along with 1875 kg of Sodium Acetate from these vehicle. In these cases, the arrestees: Sai Naw Kham @ Ike Pauk, Tin Maung @ Sin Du Nat , Aung Ye Zaw @ Ko Phyo, Ye Win Latt @ Ko Ye, Sai Hla Maung @ Shan Kular have been charged with the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances laws.



### The Seizure of 5300 kg of Sodium Acetate, 2400 kg of Potassium Sulfate, 6750 kg of Sodium Carbonate, 380 kg of Sodium Chloride, 18 odor marks and 105 air filters

137. On 11-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (24) Lashio conducted a search towards 1 TOYOTA HIACE on Mandalay-Muse road near Pansone village in Hsenwi Township and seized 2500 kg of Sodium Acetate. In this case, the offenders; Tin Aung Hla, Hla Ngwe, Arr Phyin, Arr San, Nyi Nyi Lwin @ Nyi Nyi (Not arrested), Ar Min (Not arrested) have been taken action under the law in Hsenwi Police Station. According to the follow-up investigation, No.22 Anti-Narcotic Taskforce conducted a search towards a warehouse of brick factory at Kaungmutone quarter in Muse Township and 1250 kg of Sodium Acetate, 2400 kg of Potassium Sulfate, 6750 kg of sodium carbonate, 380 kg of Sodium chloride, 18 odor masks and 105 air filters. In this case, all offenders; Han Min Aung, Htet Gyi, Khaing



Su Nwe @ Khaing Su, Nyi Nyi Lwin @ Nyi Nyi(Not arrested), Than Htike Oo (not arrested), Mr.Thein Yi (Not arrested), Sayar Kyaung @ U Chaw (Not arrested) have been charged with the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Law in Muse Police Station. According to the interrogation, the officers seized 1550 kg of sodium acetate from a warehouse at Swan Saw quarter in Lashio Township and 2 arrestees; Khaing Su Nwe @) Khaing Su and Thura Kyaw have been charged with Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Laws in Lashio Police Station.



### **The seizure of 14500 kg of Theophylline Anhydrous, 3000 kg of Ammonium Nitrate and 2000 kg of Copper Sulfate**

138. On 25-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (22) Muse Taskforce seized 14500 kg of Theophylline Anhydrous worth 0.435 billion kyats from the warehouse no.6 inside field no.(Mawa/535), Mant Weine (2) street, Swan Saw quarter. According to the follow-up investigation, the officers seized 3000 kg of Ammonium Nitrate and 2000 kg of Copper Sulfate from a garage of Shwe Lion at No.(H-247/1), 51 street, between 138 st x 139 st, in Pyae gyi Takhon Township. In the case, Kyi Zin Tun and Maung Si Sin @ Thein Hlaing Oo @ Thein Naing (Not arrested) have been taken action under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances laws in Muse Police Station. In relation to the seizure of 3000 kg of Ammonium Nitrate and 2000 kg of Copper Sulphate, Wai Lin @ Wai Lin Tun and Kyi Zin Tun have been prosecuted with the laws in Industrial Regional Police Station.



### **The seizure of 1500 kg of Caffeine**

139. On 26-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (7) Kyaing Ton searched a SHN 1N-1611 ISUZU at Sanlu - Gawpa village road in Tachileik Township and seized 1500 kg of Caffeine. It was filed in Tachileik Police Station.





### The seizure of 35950 kg of Ammonium Nitrate

140. On 26-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (24) Lashio searched a 22-wheel vehicle at Yepu check point, Chaung sar village in Hsenwi Township and seized 35950 kg of Ammonium Nitrate. In the case, the offenders Aung Ko Min (Aka) Taunggyi, Hein Min Zaw, Phyo Min Hein (not arrested) have been taken action under the law in Hsenwi Police Station.



### The seizure of 62880 kg of Ammonium Nitrate

141. On 26-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (17) Mandalay (South) searched a Nissan vehicle at 16 miles check point in Patheingyi Township and seized 16400 kg of Ammonium Nitrate. The offenders; Win Myaing, Yan Myo Aung, Thet Naung, Sai Tun Win, Phyo Min Hein (Not arrested) have been taken action under the law in Ohn Chaw Police station. According to the interrogation, on 27-7-2022, the officers arrested Thet Naung and Sai Tun Win along with 46480 kg of Ammonium Nitrate from a warehouse in a fruit company, Sarkalayinn village and all arrestees have been charged with the Narcotic drugs and psychotropic Substances laws in Myitngae Regional Police Station.



### The seizure of 6090 liters of Toluene

142. On 23-8-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (17) Mandalay (South) searched a Toyota Hiace at 16 mile check point in Patheingyi Township and seized 170 liters of Toluene. Under the interrogation, it was revealed that 1500 liters of toluene from "THUREIN LIN" shore, 4420 liters of Toluene from "BHI Paint Co., Ltd", in total amount of 6090 liters were seized. In

relation to the seizure of 170 liters of Toluene, Nyein Than and Han Win Maung @ Bo Han, Thi Thi Swe and Chan Thar Htay @ Ko Chan were prosecuted with the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances law in Ohn Chaw Regional Police Station. In relation to the seizure of 1500 kg of Toluene, Thi Thi Swe, Myo Min Thu and Manager Win Swe from "Royal Aung Chan International Co., Ltd" have been taken action under the law in Aungmyae Tharzan Police Station. In relation to the seizure of 4420 liters of Toluene, Myo Min Thu has been charged with the laws in Aungmyae Tharzan police Station.



### The seizure of 19600 liters of Toluene

143. On 26-8-2022, Custom department of Mandalay region searched MDY 1Q-6081 Nissan at 16 mile check point in Patheingyi Township and seized 19600 liters of Toluene. In this case, Min Min Ko @ Min Ko Naing and Ye Win (not arrested) have been taken action under the law in Pyigy Takhon Police Station.



### The seizure of 1.3 million of Pseudoephedrine tablets and 360 liters of Ethyl Ether

144. On 30-8-2022, Sagaing distinct police seized NISSAN UD vehicle along 1.3 million of Pseudoephedrine, 360 liters of Ethyl Ether on the Sagaing-Moywar road in Sagaing. In this case, the offenders Nyein Chan Oo, Kyi Hlaing, Nue Garmmar @ Zaw Lin Naing, Maung Dwe and Sat Maung have been taken action under the laws in the Sagaing Regional Police Station.



### The seizure of 87250 kg of Ammonium Nitrate

145. On 5-9-2022, X-Ray Device Anti-Narcotic Unit (Nyaungkhar Shay) searched MON 6E-8136 HINO vehicle and seized 8.25 tons of ammonium nitrate. Under the interrogation, No.3 Anti-Narcotic Sub-division searched YGN 3I-6346 CANDA and seized 20 tons of Ammonium Nitrate. Interrogation towards offenders revealed that 54.35 tons of Ammonium Nitrate were seized from a warehouse in Dagon Myothit Township and on 7-9-2022, 32900 kg of Nitrate were seized on No.1 Train to Mandalay – Yangon railway in Mandalay station. In relation to the seizure of 8.25 tons of ammonium Nitrate, Than Naing Htoo @ Connie, Lin Tun, Kyaw Zin Phyo @ Kyaw Min Khant, Moe Gyi @ Yee Yee Win and Thin Thin Mar have been taken action under the laws in Mingalar Tanung Nyunt Township. In relation to the seizure of 54.35 tons of ammonium Nitrate, Aung Aung Tun (not arrested), Ko Sai @ Peter (not arrested), Thin Thin Mar and Moe Gyi @ Yee Yee Win have been taken action under the laws in Dagon Police Station. In the seizure of 32.9 tons of ammonium nitrate, Thin Thin Mar, Yee Yee Win @ Ma Moe Gyi, Zaw Lin, Ko Sai @ Ko Peter (not arrested) and Mi Mi Khaing (still investigation) have been taken action under the laws in Mandalay Railway Police Station.



### The seizure of 13650 liters of Sulphuric Acid, 5400 kg of Sodium Ethoxide, 2160 liters of Methanol Nitric Acid

146. On 2-10-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (23) Tangyan searched FAW vehicle at the entrance of Mong Ye and seized 1360 liters of Sulphuric acid, 5400 kg of Sodium Ethoxide, 2160 liters of Methanol Nitric Acid. In this case, Than Tun Win (Aka) Ei Tar and Myo Aung have been taken action under the laws in Mong Ye Police Station.



### The seizure of 4300 liters of Sulphuric Acid

147. On 26-10-2022, X-Ray Device Anti-Narcotic Unit (Myogyi) searched YGN 5B-6810 NISSAN UD vehicle driven by Kyaw Thet Aung at X-Ray check points and seized 4300 liters of Sulphuric Acid. In this case, all offenders Tun Tun, Nyo Nyo (female), Kyaw Kyaw Lwin, Myat Thu @ Thar Gyi, Si Thu Aung @ Thar Ngae were arrested along with MDY 3B-4828 ISUZU EXTRA CUB. Under the interrogation, it was revealed that Myo Than @ Pyaung Gyi @ Tayoke (Not arrested) was an organizer to carry drugs. In this case, all arrestees have been taken action under the laws in Ngarngan Police Station.



### The seizure of 1350 kg of Caffeine and 4 blenders which are used in illicit drug production

148. On 28-12-2022, Anti-narcotic Unit (30) Tachileik searched SHN 1L-9521 Nissan GE-13 driven by Sai San Khay accompanied with Sai Hlaing Pan leading to Keng Tong from Tachileik, at the Mae Yan check point and seized 1350 kg of Caffeine along with 4 blenders which are used in drug production. Under the interrogation, it was revealed that Sai Naung who lived in Wanlone village of Tachileik Township organized to carry drugs. All offenders were charged with the law in Haunglaike Regional Police Station.



### The seizure of 1000 kg of Caffeine

149. On 30-12-2022, a combined team including Military and Myanmar Police Force searched YGN 1L-9383 FUSO vehicle driven by Khun Maung Paye at the Mae Yan check point and seized 1000 kg of Caffeine during the search. Under the interrogation, it revealed that Khun Wai Lu @ Khun Lu who organized to carry drugs was arrested in Taunggyi Township.



All arrestees have been charged with the laws in Haunglaike Regional Police Station.



### Seizures of Firearms and ammunitions

150. On 9-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (21) Kunlong arrested Low Sie Shaw (aka) Ashaw after intercepting his Alphard vehicle near Kaung Kyae village of Kwan Lon Township and some weapons namely one RUGER PRECISION Sniper, 3 M4 CARBINE, 1 M22 assault Rifle, 1 Type 56 assault Rifle, 1 Colt Commando, 16 pistols, 40 different types of magazines, 910 cartridges for various firearms were recovered from him. According to his statement, he was hired by Kawl Phyin to transport them to Laukkaing Township. Both of them are facing charge of contravention of the Shan States Arms Order.



### Seizures of Firearms and ammunitions

151. On 18-7-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (56) Mogok arrested Zaw Min Oo after intercepting his vehicle at the checkpoint on Pyin Oo Lwin-Moe Gyke road, and 9 AK 47 rifles, 27 assault Rifles, 2 M4 Rifles, 32 different types of magazines, and 1165 cartridges for various firearms were recovered from the containers of the vehicle. The arrest told the police that he was hired by Ko Ko Htet (Male) and Maw Maw Aung (Female) to transport the firearms. Investigation into the arrestees is ongoing.



### Seizures of Firearms and ammunitions

152. On 7-9-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (38) Mawlamyine arrested two men and their vehicle in the vicinity of Myawaddy-Mawlamyine Road, Kyaikmaraw Township, and 4 PANZER ARMS GEN 2 BP 12, 5 pistols, 27 types of magazines and 100 of cartridges for various firearms along with various firearms equipment were seized from them. According to their statement, they were hired by Saw Per Htee Eh Kaw, to transport the firearms, and officers conducted a follow-up operation towards the residential unit of Saw Per Htee Eh Kaw, in the vicinity of Ward 4, Myawaddy Township and 1 gun SILENCER, 5 of 9 mm rounds, and other illegal equipment linked to the terrorists groups were recovered from his unit. Those who related to this case are charged with respective law.





### Seizures of Firearms and ammunitions

153. On 28-9-2022, X-Ray Device Anti-Narcotic Unit (Nyaungkhar Shay) arrested Ye Min Paing (Male), accompanied by Wai Yan Oo (Male) after detecting their 12 wheels tractor trailer passing through the X-ray scanner, their trailer was showed the suspicious images. After X-ray imaging, officers searched and recovered 2 Colt Commando, 2 MK 12 Special Purpose Rifle, 9 - 12 GA Magnum Semi-Auto, 1- 22 LR CZ rim fire rifle, 1 Glock 43 semi-auto pistol, 1 Micro 9 Rapide, 3 SIG SAUER pistols, 1 Glock 17 Gen 4 pistol, 1250 cartridges for various firearms, and 82 types of magazines from the vehicles. After that, Zaw Min Oo @ Min Min who is the mastermind to transport the firearms was arrested in the vicinity of street 59 (A), Kanthaya Ward, Chan Mya Thar Zi Township. All the arrestees from this case were taking actions in accordance the respective law.



### Seizures of Firearms and ammunitions

154. On 29-9-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (64) Kunhing was conducting the petrol check at the Takaw cooperation checkpoint, the suspicious vehicle was stopped near the checkpoint without drivers. Officers checked a vehicle and led to the seizure of some weapons and ammunitions and found the Identification Card from the vehicle. In a follow up operation conducted, officers intercepted the residential unit in the vicinity of Takaw village group, MyinePyin Township, where was showed in the Identification card and noted that Sai Naw Kan is the owner of the suspicious vehicle. Those convicted of the illegal possessing of firearms faced on charge of contravention of the Shan States Arms Order.



### Seizures of Firearms and 0.68 million stimulant tablets

155. On 15-12-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (17) Mandalay (North) arrested Zun Ko Latt (Male) and Khin Lae Yi Phyo (Female) along with 0.18 million of stimulant tablets at the corner of 60 x 42 street, Mahar Aung Myay Township, Mandalay region. They were escorted to their residential unit in the vicinity of Sartoe ward in Myitnge Township and found half of million stimulant tablets. They said that Sai Laung Kham had directed



them to sell the drugs and other drug law enforcement officers raided the hotel in the vicinity of ward 5, Myawaddy Township, and arrested 4 person, namely, Sai Laung Kham, Nay Tun Hla, Aung Ko Htwe, and Kyin Chang, along with some 15 firearms and ammunitions. Subsequently, another two persons were arrested along with 900 kg of Ketamine, 3 kg of ICE, some 17 firearms and ammunitions. All the suspects related with this case were charged under the respective law.



### Seizures of Firearms and 0.68 million stimulant tablets

156. On 16-12-2022, Anti-Narcotic Unit (27) Loilem arrested Sai Swan Won, and Naung Kham after intercepting their vehicle, and some 5 firearms and its related equipment were recovered from their vehicle. Those convicted of the illegal possession of firearms faced on charge of contravention of the Shan States Arms Order.



### The seizure of ATS production camps, illicit drugs, tableting machines and its related substances

157. On 10-3-2022, a combined team including Military and Myanmar Police Force searched and raided on the area 3 mile far away of Mae Kyar Nwe village in Mong Sat Township and seized 4 rainproof huts including 0.34 million ATS tablets, 5 kg of crushed ATS powder, 4 kg of ICE, 1000 kg of Caffeine, 3 of ATS tableting machines (19 pills in one time), 1 blenders, 40 “WY” tableting moulds, 40 tableting moulds without logo, 20 bottles of “Money” odor liquid, 5 gas bottles, 3 drying trays, 3 steel plates (6 x 6) during the search. It was filed in Mong Twam Regional Police Station.



### The seizure of ATS production camps, illicit drugs, tableting machines and its related substances

158. On 12-11-2022, the Military searched and raided the area of Tayarkok village, Lwetawkham village tacks in Tachileik and arrested Kya Kyoe and Kyaw Sein inside a shelter (NC-721647). Continuously, Kyar Yaw, Kya Kawt, Kya Law, Dayala, Eik Yi(Aka) Keng Yee and Kya Yu were arrested along with 2.733 million ATS tablets, 253 kg of crushed ATS powder, 3 kg of opium 29 kg of Caffeine, 31.6 kg of Vanillin powder, 12.6 liters of Promethazine liquid, 84.2 liters of odor liquid, 35 kg of Food colour, 1 tableting machine (19 pills in one time), 20





“Tg” tableting moulds, 20 “WY” tableting moulds, 46 tableting moulds, 46 tableting moulds without logo, 5 blander machines, 7 trays for tablets drying and related substances which are used in ATS production. Moreover, 2 of AK-47 guns, 1 of M-22 gun, 1 of 22 guns, 1 of bore gun, 3 magazines, 15 bullets were seized. Under the follow-up investigation, on 14-11-2022, the officers searched Bawza (Aka) Bawsa’s house in Yepusan village in Tachileik Township and arrested him along with 41360 ATS tablets and 1 blender machine. Interrogation towards the arrestee Kya Kawt’s house, 7392 ATS tablets, 0.7 kg of crushed ATS powder and 0.1 kg of Vanillin powder were seized. In relation to the seizure of illicit drugs, tableting machines, its related substances and ammunitions, all arrestees have been charged with the Narcotic drugs and Psychotropic Substances laws in Tachileik Township.

## Supervision of Controlled Precursor Chemicals

1. The Central Committee for Drug Abuse Control was reconstituted under the Notification No. (314/2021) of the State Administration Council and the (11) working group were constituted with the supervision of the Central Committee and designated their duties. In the Committee for the Supervision of Controlled Precursor Chemicals included in the (11) working group constituted by the Central Committee, Deputy Chief (2) of Myanmar Police Force acts as Chairman and (12) representatives are involved and performing as members from the respective departments.

2. On July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2004, the Rules on the Supervision of Controlled Chemicals were issued with (14) Chapters under the Notification No. (3/2004) of the Ministry of Home Affairs and there has been following and undertaking in line with the rules. Besides the anti-narcotic units conduct the drug enforcement works for the precursor chemicals not to divert into the situation to produce the illicit narcotic drugs, and the control, monitoring and supervision were conducted for the chemicals which were applied to produce the household goods through the official ways to transport into Myanmar and not to flow into the wrong ways.

3. On July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2009, the State/Region Controlled Precursor Chemicals Inspection Committees were constituted under the Rules on the Supervision of Controlled Precursor Chemicals for the transports across States / Regions, storage, possession, and retail and whole sale distribution of the controlled precursor chemicals not to divert into the illegal ways, and the field inspections have been conducting for the controlled precursor chemicals to reach actually to the End Product.

4. On May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021, the Ministry of Health and Sports issued again the notification order No. 113/2021 for (39) types of controlled chemicals which are corresponding with the current situation according to the United Nations Conventions and the necessity of Myanmar, as follows:

5. The Committee for the supervision of controlled precursor chemicals scrutinized and endorsed in line with the rules and field-inspections made by the respective region/state inspection teams for controlled precursor chemicals as follows in 2022 when the companies,

The committee has been scrutinizing and approving the companies and domestic entrepreneurs and departmental organizations for the use and resale of the chemicals to receive the import permission and in 2022, there were a total of 65 companies/ entrepreneurs; 50 companies/ entrepreneurs, 11 companies/ entrepreneurs for wholesale, 3 applications for permission from the departmental and 1 company for its own-use in domestic production.

7. For the preventions of illegal smuggling of controlled chemicals and arriving from the diverted way through licit trade of controlled chemicals, the controlled precursor chemicals were scrutinized and supervised in Regions/ State not to divert the wrong ways, there were 749 times of surprised/ regular inspections, 515 times of educative talks and 391 times of transport from Yangon Region across other Regions / States, which were monitored and supervised in 2022.

8. The substances that can be used in the production of illicit drugs are listed in the Schedules 1 and 2 of the United Nations Convention against Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (1988) and most of the countries have enacted laws and controlled such substances it has been observed that their isotopes and pre-precursor are being used alternately in illicit drug production by banding the prescribed laws. Thus, designer precursors, derivatives of the said chemicals, are proliferating rapidly.

9. Implementing Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) in line with stipulated guidelines plays a key role in prevention of abusing and diversion of controlled chemicals, non-controlled chemicals and hazardous substances used in drug production. Therefore, awareness raising programmes are suffixed to the workshops held in conjunction with chemical importing/exporting companies, entrepreneurs, concerning departments and organizations in order to implement the aforesaid preventive measures.

10. It is important that Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) are implemented in accordance with existing guidelines to prevent the misuse and diversion of controlled chemicals, uncontrolled chemicals and hazardous materials used in drug production. Therefore, in implementing like this, with the related departments including companies/entrepreneurs engaged in chemical business and by chemical associations, education and notification of regulations, procedures, laws, rules, rules and policies issued through workshops on controlled chemicals are being carried out.

11. Annual Report Questionnaire-ARQ of United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime- UNODC bases in Vienna, Austria has been sent out to the relevant ministries to be filled with the designated forms and then collected and replied to UNODC and also replied the questions of INCB.

12. In case of conducting to import controlled precursor chemicals from abroad for companies/ entrepreneurs in Myanmar, and through the system of Pre-Export Notification (PEN) which can speedily exchange the information in 2022, there were 103 times of communicating and undertaking from member states; Malaysia, Thailand, Singapore, Indonesia, China and Korea, 81 times of approval were replied and 22 times were objected because of wrong documents.

# Chapter - 6

## Activities of Myanmar Anti-Narcotics Association

### Introduction

1. In honor of International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking Day, Myanmar Anti-Narcotics Association (MANA) was founded by interested volunteers from different sectors on 26<sup>th</sup> June 1994. It was registered by the Registration Unit of the General Administration Department of the Ministry of Home Affairs dated 12<sup>th</sup> October 1994. On 18<sup>th</sup> September 2017, MANA received a temporary registered number of National Organizations from the Registrar General Department, Ministry of Home Affairs.

2. Vision of MANA is a Drug-free Society. Goal of MANA is a Healthier and Safer Society where the impacts of drug and substance abuse are minimized and there is increased access to a better quality of life for at risk populations including drug users and their communities. Mission of MANA is that MANA works by its own Strategic Plan and Operational Plan by each 5years arrangement (2016-2020), (2011-2015) and (2006-2010). Fundamental of MANA's SP/OP: Demand Reduction, Harm Reduction, Project/Program Collaboration and Service Integration to work directly for targeted end beneficiaries based on their prioritized needs. MANA, one of the National Non-Governmental Organizations, has been vigorously working for anti-narcotic activities as a National Concern for more than two decades, and at the same time, Regional and State level MANA Branches have been fully established well across the country. Organization's funds were increased than the fund of previous years by dedicated efforts of fund-raising activities led by the President of MANA and respective supporting groups. The organization as a whole also improved by the efforts of consultants group working in effective collaboration with respective Ministries - Ministry of Health, Ministry of Home Affairs - and working together with other stakeholders - UN agencies, INGOs, NGOs, CBOs, CSOs and other relevant partners. In addition, MANA has uninterruptedly provided Information Education Sessions on harms of gate-keeper drugs that are smoking cigarettes and drinking alcohol.

8. The President and Secretary attended the Preliminary Meeting on International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking on 26<sup>th</sup> April 2022 in No.6 State High School, Insein township.

9. On 26<sup>th</sup> June 2022, the Ceremony of Burning the seized drugs was held in Hlaingthayar Township. And for it, MANA President and U Sai Aung Min, Chairperson of Yangon Region MANA attended the ceremony.

### **Religious Affairs of MANA**

10. There was a 14<sup>th</sup> serial of an accomplished Ceremony on Waso Thinkan Kut Hlu Pwe on 21<sup>st</sup> January 2022. And, all the MANA CEC Members, Yangon Region MANA and MANA Staffs attended it.

11. On 20<sup>th</sup> October 2022, a Kahtein Thingan Kut Hlu Pwe was held in MANA Head Quarter. All the MANA members and staff attended it.

### **Youth Sector**

12. (a) 8 drug users were provided with post-care services.  
(b) 8 drug users were provided with the series of counseling

### **Health Care Center**

13. MANA Youth Empowerment Team (MYET) created a room for Health Care Center that is providing health care services for 3 days a week with a contribution of a medical doctor and a nurse.

### **MANA Exhibition Room in CCDAC Building**

14. As per instruction of Deputy Minister of Ministry of Home Affairs, MANA Exhibition room will be established and right now it is on process.

### **Financial Matter**

15. Monthly financial report to the President of MANA and other CEC members is conducted by MANA Finance CEC Team in a monthly basis regarding income and expenses of MANA Head Quarter. In terms of Project Matters of MANA, the respective external Audit Teams hired by UNOPS conduct the auditing activities on the budget and actual expenses yearly.

### **Conclusion**

16. In 2022, MANA expanded the areas of MANA Branches across the country reaching village levels in order to establish a sound drug free society. MANA coordinated and collaborated with all the counterpart associations as well. Central MANA got involved in the discussions

on “Today Youth and Awareness sessions on drug use”. In addition, MANA Branches across the country provided the Information, Education and Awareness sessions for students and out-of-students. MANA Head Quarter and Branches gave instruction to the respective project staff as required to meet the need in all levels. MANA participated in the 7 thematic areas of priority interventions: to abstain from drug use, smoking, betel nut chewing and alcohol, safe driving and abiding traffic rules and regulation, living with healthy life-style, prevention of sexual exploitation and abuse (PSEA), and prevention from addiction on game playing in which MANA contributed booklets, DVD and Posters. Finally, MANA would like to mention that Myanmar Anti-Narcotics Association has vigorously been coordinating and collaborating with CCDAC and all the departments of Government, CBO and CSO for anti-narcotic activities such as demand and harm reduction interventions.

## Activities of Border Areas Development Association

1. Border Areas Development Association (BDA) believes steadfastly that with the improvement of socio-economic lives of the people including education, health, livelihood, the menace of narcotic drugs will wither away gradually.



### In Cooperation with UNICEF

2. BDA has organized the training for the children to mitigate stress, ill health and provide learning. BDA has organized training for mental health first aid, psychological first aid care course and four clean processes (hand hygiene) education, for the 8622 children and pupils from 79 villages and 6 wards in Monwya Township. They were taught by 148 facilitators. BDA has also organized discussion and workshop for the parents of the communities, where they discuss about the danger of narcotic.

### Short Term Home-based Learning Project

3. BDA has organized Short Term Home-based Learning Project from December 8, 2021 to June 7, 2022 for the 8622 children and pupils who cannot attend school regularly in



Monwya Township. 153, facilitators are teaching those children and pupils from 79 villages and 6 wards in Monwya Township. BDA has also organized discussing group for the community elders. They help in supervising the children and pupils in the villages. BDA has distributed stationery for the children and provided wash materials for the centers. Facilitators received honorarium. As this project has benefited everybody in the villages all are very happy.



### Health

4. BDA cannot launch medical trips to States and Regions as before. But BDA has contributed one oxygen concentrators, four Medical Regulators & Oxygen Cylinder and also rice and foodstuff to the poor people.

### Livelihood

5. So as to improve socio-economic live of the people in border and rural areas, BDA has implemented microfinance project in Monwya Township since 2013 as NGO. Then in 2018 it was transformed into Co.,Ltd by the name of Yadanar Thanlar Microfinance Co., Ltd, according to the directive of FRD. We carry on with our work in helping the households and



have already provided loan of Kyats (18000) Lakhs. In 2022, in the present situation BDA had only collected 5% of the loan monthly.

6. Though BDA is facing very tight financial problem, it has provided loan of 145.75 million kyats in 2022. By these fund BDA has supported our people in the following works:

### Annual General Meeting

7. The achievements of BDA within these three years were reported at the Annual General Meeting held at Royal Garden Restaurant on 25 November, 2022. BDA had honored Adviser and EC member of BDA - Professor Mya Thein Han who was awarded (Theikpa Kyaw Swar) Title, U Zeya Thura Mon who was awarded (Agamaharthiri Thudhama Mani Zotadara) title and Dr. San Win who was awarded (Wanna Kyaw Htin) Title by the Head of State.



### Drug risk prevention work

8. Since the establishment of Association in 1966, BDA has been cooperating with the Center for Narcotic and Psychotropic Substances Prevention and Control in drug control activities. In every activity carried out by the Association, educational lectures on the elimination of drug abuse are held together. The Association's gallery opened at the Narcotics Eradication Memorial Museum in Yangon is also being renovated.

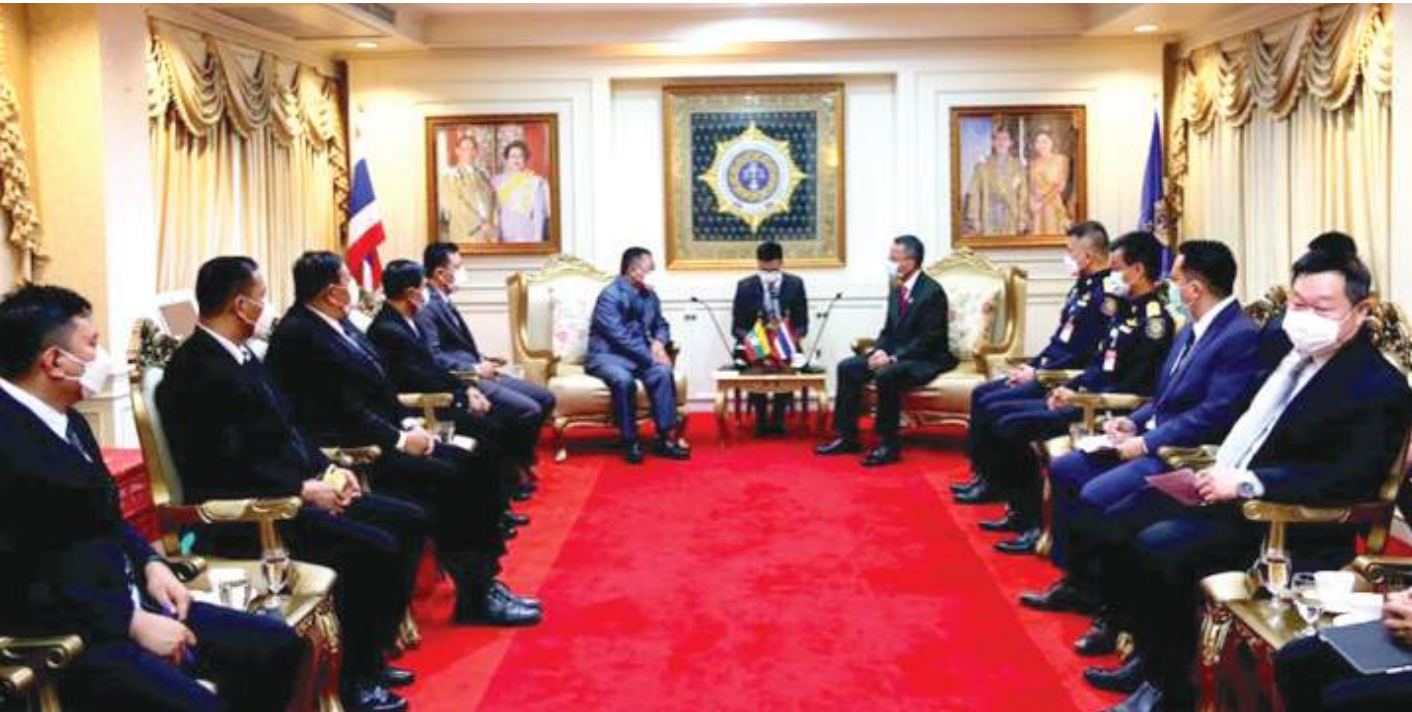


## International Cooperation

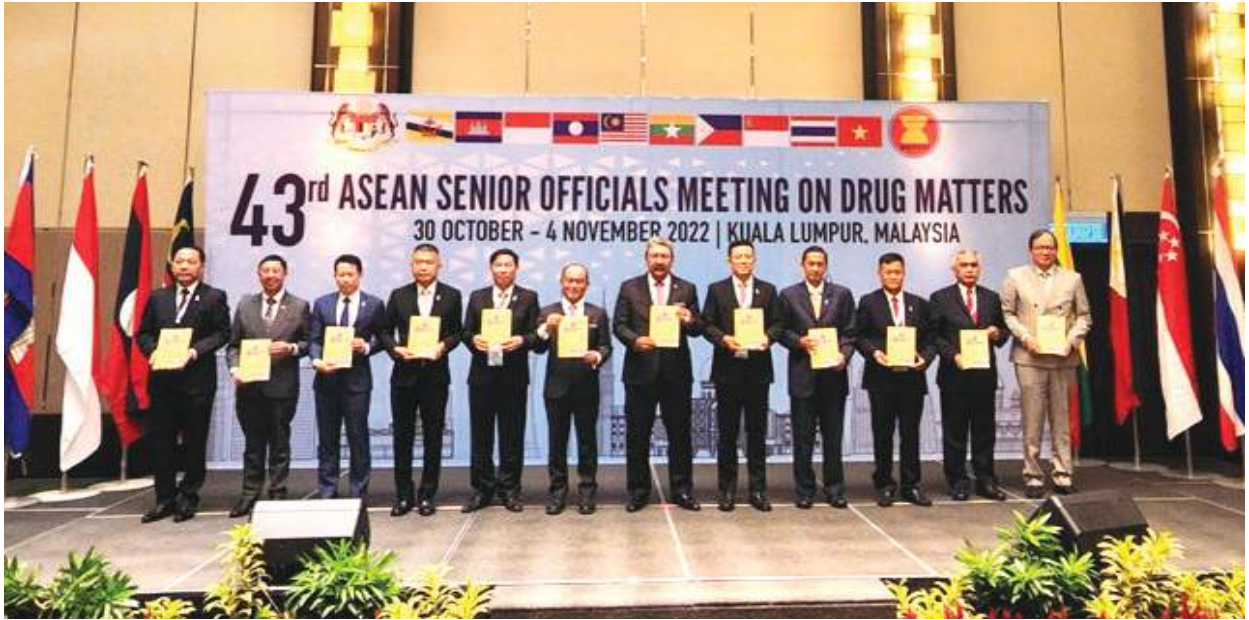

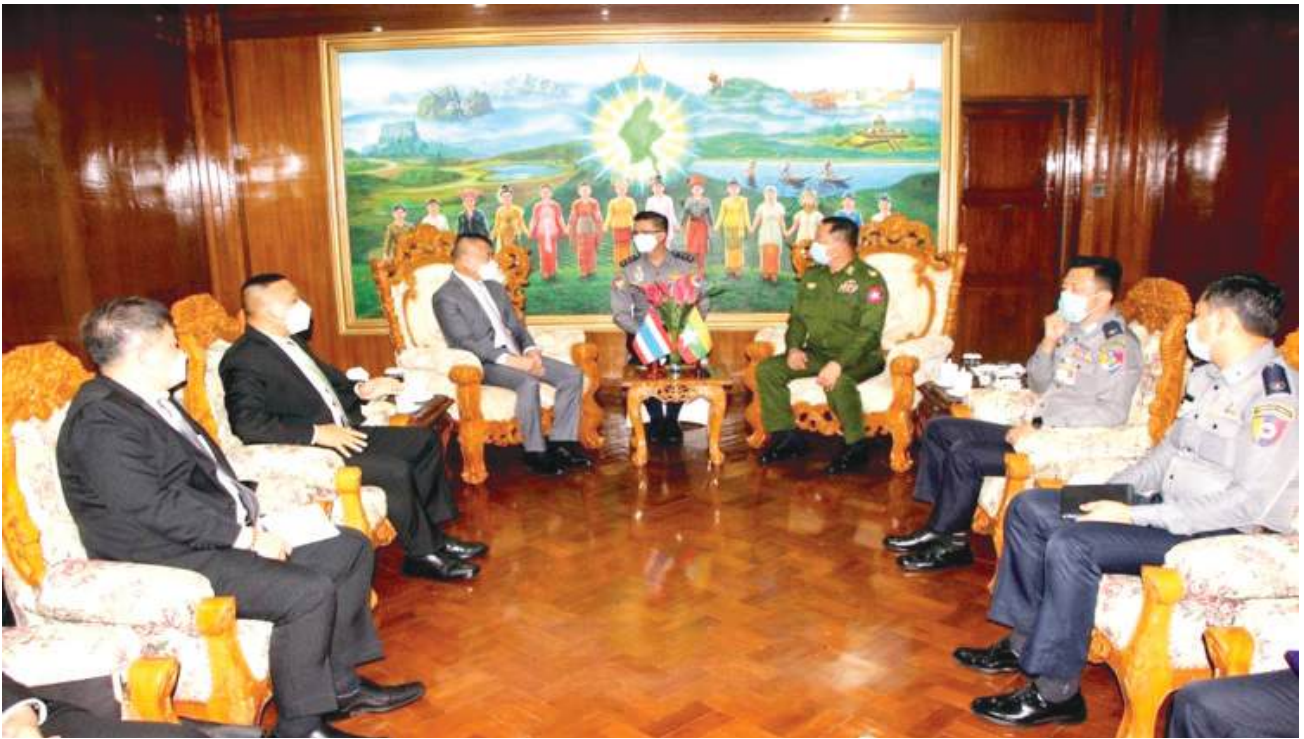

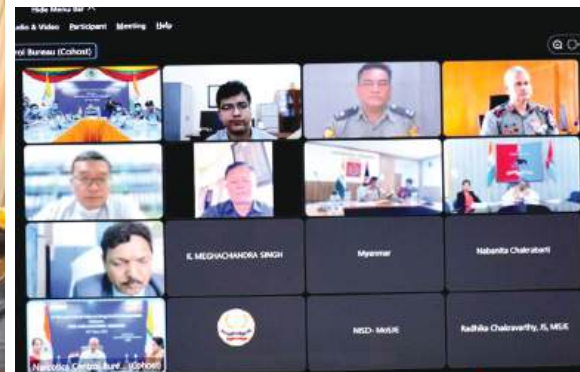

# Conclusion


The problem of drug abuse may lead to serious addiction, causing infectious disease that may lead to fatality. Furthermore, it may have serious effect on the development of the state, a downgrade in producing goods, job absence, causing jeopardy in work atmosphere. And as for the society atmosphere, it may have severe effects by losing strength of the youths, school absence, separation among the family members, and the profits gained from drug related activities will only generate more strength for the criminals and terrorist groups, in which will become a threat for the national security and stability of the country.

In emphasizing the problem of drug for this emerging era, we have realized that not only law enforcement and judicial criteria must be intact, but as well the oriented approaches of public health care, uplifting the living standards, and human rights development are highly necessary to support one another in covering the whole problem of drugs in the country.

Since the abuse of drugs may no longer be considered as a crime, and to get proper treatment for addiction, the government organizations and civil society have amended its law and procedure. And to obtain opportunities to get treatment in the community, not only treatment and rehabilitation centers were established, community-based treatment outreach were provided for the community as well.

In order to create a drug free atmosphere in the community, parents of the youth should not only guide their children on the awareness of the danger of drugs, they should also pay close attention to their problems, and peer pressure by listening to them. Only then, the use of drugs to overcome their problems could be avoided. In rehabilitating the drug addicts, civil society must also provide support to them instead of ignoring their addiction as well. In order revive the drug addicts back to the community, and if vocational trainings are provided and nurture them with care, they will be able to maintain a drug free society and retain themselves back into the community.

The emergence of narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances and its precursors used in the drug production process will be banned and prescribed as controlled chemicals according to the amended law by the government thus the use of advanced technology, handheld devices, and machines will be used to detect and interdict drug trafficking activities to display our relentless efforts on drug elimination endeavors. That is why I would like to urge all the responsible personnel, relevant authorities, ministries and civil society to join hands together as a prioritized national duty to eliminate the problems of narcotic drugs that is threatening the peace and stability of the entire nation.
